PROCESSED REPORT ON WATER

The Commission on the Environment was organized by the New Mexico Legislature in 1969 to study and report on the state of the environment in New Mexico. The Commission's first report, "The State of the Environment in New Mexico," was published in 1970. This report, "Processed Report on Water," is the second in a series of reports on specific environmental issues. It was prepared by the Commission's Water Task Force, which was established in 1970 to study and report on the state of water resources in New Mexico.

The Water Task Force was composed of members of the Commission and other interested parties. Its mandate was to study the state of water resources in New Mexico, including the availability, quality, and distribution of water, and to recommend actions to be taken to improve the state of water resources.

The Water Task Force's report is organized into four main sections: (1) a description of the state of water resources in New Mexico, (2) a discussion of the problems facing water resources, (3) a discussion of the actions that have been taken to address these problems, and (4) a discussion of the actions that should be taken in the future.
