

FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

The above well was drilled to total depth of 3791'. The 2" tubing was run and well tested 5 barrels oil per hour with 67 MCF gas on September 14, 1938. Due to insufficient amount of gas the well will not flow steadily. It is therefore desired to shoot the pay formation from 3716' to 3784' with 125 quarts SNG to stimulate flowing conditions.

1. Introduction

The purpose of this study is to investigate the effects of various factors on the performance of a system. The study is organized as follows: Section 2 describes the system and the factors being studied. Section 3 presents the experimental design and the results of the experiments. Section 4 discusses the implications of the results and the conclusions of the study.

The system under study is a complex system with many components. The factors being studied are the input variables that affect the system's performance. The experimental design is a factorial design, which allows us to study the effects of each factor and the interactions between factors. The results of the experiments are presented in Table 1.

The results of the experiments show that the system's performance is affected by the input variables. The most significant factors are the input variables X1 and X2. The interaction between X1 and X2 is also significant.

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
