REGULATIONS AND REPORTS ON MINES

1. The purpose of this regulation is to provide a uniform method for the collection and reporting of data on the production of minerals from the public lands of the United States.

2. This regulation applies to all mines on public lands owned by the United States, whether the mines are operated by the United States, by a contractor, or by a private individual.

3. The data to be reported shall include the name of the mine, the location of the mine, the name of the operator, the date of production, the quantity of minerals produced, and the value of the minerals produced.

4. The operator of a mine shall file a report with the Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, at Washington, D. C., within a specified period of time after the end of the production period.

5. The report shall be in the form of a statement of facts, and shall be signed by the operator of the mine.

6. The Bureau of Land Management shall maintain a record of all reports filed, and shall make such reports available to the public.

7. The Bureau of Land Management shall also publish a summary of the reports filed, and shall make such summary available to the public.

8. The Bureau of Land Management shall also publish a list of the mines on public lands, and shall make such list available to the public.

9. The Bureau of Land Management shall also publish a list of the operators of mines on public lands, and shall make such list available to the public.

10. The Bureau of Land Management shall also publish a list of the minerals produced from public lands, and shall make such list available to the public.

DETAILS OF WORK

The details of work shall be as follows: The operator of a mine shall file a report with the Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, at Washington, D. C., within a specified period of time after the end of the production period.

It is hereby ordered that this plan shall be approved by the Secretary of the Interior, and that the Geological Survey shall be authorized to carry out the same.
