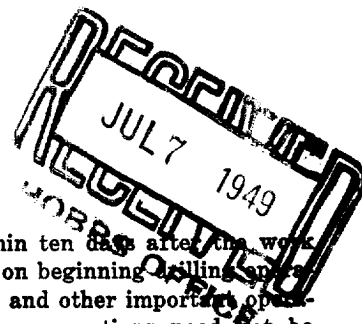

1573' of 7" casing was run and cemented, with plug pumped down at 7:00 P.M., July 6, 1949. This plug was cemented at 1573' and 1575' and 1577' and 1579'. The casing was tested with 100 lb. pressure and no pressure drop was indicated on everything was isolated on 1575'. The top of the salt by sample analysis is found to be at 1500'.
