Dear Mr. Spurrier:

In regard to our telephone conversation yesterday in regard to the F. R. Jackson, Skarda #1 Well in Sec. 3, Twp. 2N, Rng. 32E, Curry County, I shut this well down on June 9, 1949, at 5:30 P.M. at a Total Depth of 2836'. This well was shut down due to the fact that they were operating without a bond and without approval of Form C-101.

I would advise that you check the records on the Ray Pool, Skarda #1 Well in Sec. 3, Twp. 2N, Rng. 32E. If that location is correct the F. R. Jackson well would be in section two. When F. R. Jackson filed his Form C-101 this morning I advised him to have his location surveyed before I could approve the Form C-101.
