Pulled tubing and set a Robinson 3 in 1 Rubber Anchor Packer in 4-3/4" open hole at 3822'. Set 3 - 2" Bryan flow valves spaced at 1358', 1641', and 1924', and 2 couplings with 5/64" perforations at 2207' and 2490'. On 24 hour test using outside gas, well produced 62 bbls. fluid of which 50% was water.
