MR. STAMETS: Call the next case, 5469. Case 5469 being Application of Read & Stevens for an unorthodox gas well location, Chaves County, New Mexico.

MR. STEVENS: Mr. Examiner, I'm Don Stevens, Santa Fe, representing the Applicant in this Case. We have one witness to be sworn.

MR. STAMETS: Any other appearances in this The Witness will stand and be sworn, please. Case?

(Witness sworn.)

KAY C. HAVENUR

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. STEVENS:

Would you state your name, your address, your occupation and your relationship with the Applicant in this Case?

My name is Kay C. Havenor, I live in Roswell, New Mexico, I'm representing Read & Stevens as a consulting geologist.

Have you previously testified before this Commission and had your qualifications accepted by the Commission?

HAVENOR-DIRECT

A Yes, sir, I have.

MR. STEVENS: Are the Witness' qualifications acceptable?

MR. STAMETS: Yes, they are.

BY MR. STEVENS:

- Q Briefly, would you state what the Applicant seeks in this hearing?
- A The Applicant seeks approval of an unorthodox location for Pennsylvanian gas in Buffalo Valley-Penn Field, Chaves County, New Mexico.
- Q Referring to what has been marked as Exhibit
 No. 1, would you explain it for the Commission?
- A Exhibit 1 is a land ownership plat showing the ownership of leases surrounding the proposed unorthodox location in the SW/4 of Section 7, Township 15 South, Range 28 East.
- Q What is the proration unit subject in this Case?
 - A The S/2 of Section 7.
 - Q And in what respect is this location unorthodox?
- A Normally field rules provide for drilling in the NW/4 and the SE/4 of this section.
 - Q This well therefore being in the SW/4 --

(Interrupting) Would be unorthodox for that

Could you give us the ownership of a majority reason. of the acreage surrounding this proposed location?

The majority of the acreage surrounding the proposed location is owned or controlled by Read & Stevens. Read & Stevens are also the operators of all of the offset wells.

Referring to what has been marked as Exhibit 2, would you go through it for the Commission, please?

Exhibit 2 is a structure contour map with the datum being the top of the Atoka formation. This map shows a gentle structural configuration with a relatively gentle southeast dip. be much structural control on accumulation in Buffalo Valley - Penn Field. This map also shows the location of our cross section marked AA' which is of significance in its relationship to the proposed location and the two adjacent wells, the Piatt Well on the south in Section 18 and the Lulu Well to the north in Section 7.

How does the structural position of the proposed location compare with the standard location as regards to previously completed wells, up-dip and down-dip?

A The proposed location would be slightly high structurally to the Piatt Well; located to the south would be up-dip structurally from a standard location in the SE/4 of Section 7, and could, in that sense, enhance the geological position of the proposed location. However, it is significant that there has been no water found as of this date at any subsea datum in the Atoka sand in the Buffalo Valley-Penn area.

- Q Therefore, is this a fair statement: A lower structural position wouldn't necessarily have a greater likelihood of being a dry hole?
- A That is a true statement. It would not necessarily enhance drilling a dry hole.
- Q Referring to what has been marked as Exhibit No. 3, would you explain it, please?
- A Exhibit No. 3 is an isopach map purported to show the total thicknesses of porous sands developed in the field area. I would like to call the attention of the Examiner to Exhibit 4 at the same time, particularly in relationship to two center wells: The Piatt Well and the Probaw A Well, which is located immediately to the west of the proposed location. The zones colored in yellow on Exhibit 4, the cross section, are sands

within the Atoka. The sands are not necessarily correlative from well to well as far as a continuous sand body would be concerned. The isopach map Figure 3 is attempting to map an environment in which we have the highest possibility in encountering the thickest sand sequence. This does not mean that sands do not occur to the east of our 10-foot isopach line, nor does it mean that we could not anticipate significantly greater thicknesses of sand, say, in the center part of Section 12 within the 30-foot isopach interval. This area is extremely difficult to map, and as I have stated before on presentations in Buffalo Valley, this type of an isopach map is very subjective rather than leaning to objective, but it is the only method that we have found that at least halfway accurately shows the relationships of the sands derially. If you will note in Section 6 on Figure 3, there is a rather significant buldge or thickening of the sands towards the east; there is indication in the S/2 of Section 7 that we could also have a similar situation, and in the SE/4 of Section 20 you will please note that a well there had an excess of 10-feet of sand which did contain gas shows. The significance of this is that we believe the entire S/2 of Section 7 to be underlain by

Atoka sands carrying gas -- some may be subcommercial, but the entire half section, the proration unit, is underlain by gas-bearing Atoka sands.

Q Referring to these wells in Section 5 and say Section 19. Was there gas encountered in the drilling of those wells?

A Gas shows were encountered in the drilling of these wells.

- Q Considered to be noncommercial at the time?
- A At the time they were drilled they were considered noncommercial, that is correct.
- Q Could you detail for us the Lulu Well in the N/2 of Section 7, dry hole?

A This well was drilled in 1970 and we now have considerable hindsight. At that time we were looking primarily for what we thought was the main pay sand.

- Q Excuse me. Who drilled this well?
- A Read & Stevens.
- Q Thank you.
- A The main pay-sand we anticipated in the interval colored blue on Exhibit 4 and we found instead a lime section. Sands were encountered above what we thought was the main interval; they were carrying shows

HAVENOR-DIRECT

of gas, but at the time, 1970, we felt that any gas obtained from those zones would not be commercial at 1970 prices. The well was subsequently plugged and abandoned as a result of that. However, I might add that Read & Stevens have seriously considered the possibility of re-entering this well.

Q With your testimony that the entire south half is underlain by gas, what is the purpose of your proposing the exception to the rule by drilling in the southwest quarter?

A We believe that the drilling of the well in the SW/4 of Section 7 will provide a more efficient means of recovery of the gas that is allocated and the correlative rights protected for the S/2 of Section 7, whereas a well drilled at a standard location would have, according to our projection of thickness of sand, would have gas; it would be difficult to impossible to obtain the gas underlying the SW/4 of that Section.

Q In your opinion, would the wells in Sections
12 and 13 and 18 tend to produce some of the gas underlying the SW/4 of Section 7 unless this Application
were granted?

A We believe that there has been some drainage

To your knowledge, are there other exceptions already. to the spacing regulations in this field?

Yes, sir, there have been several exceptions to the regular spacing pattern. One is shown on this map in the SW/4 of Section 6, the Read & Stevens No. 1 Midwest Well.

And there are others in the field not shown Q on this map?

- Yes, there are others not shown on this map.
- Were those wells penalized in their allowable, A Q to your knowledge?
 - Those that I have knowledge of were not penalized.
- In your opinion would the granting of this Application tend to protect the correlative rights and prevent waste?
- Yes, sir. That is the purpose of the Applica-Α tion.
 - Were Exhibits 1 through 4 prepared by you? Q
 - Yes, they were.







THEREFORE applicant requests that this matter be set for hearing before the Commission, or before the Commission's duly appointed examiner, and that after notice and hearing as required by law, the Commission enter its order approving an unorthodox gas well location for Pennsylvanian production, as requested above.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on May 26 , 1975, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter R.L. Stamets

NOW, on this day of May, 1975, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
 - (2) That the applicant, Read & Stevens, seeks approval of a gas well location 990 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the East line of Section 7, Township 15 South, Range 28 East, NMPM, to test the Pennsylvanian formation, Buffalo Valley-Pennsylvanian Gas Pool, Chaves County, New Mexico.

- (3) That the 5/2 of said Section 7 is to be dedicated to the well.
- (4) That a well at said unorthodox location will better enable applicant to produce the gas underlying the proration unit.
- (5) That no offset operator objected to the proposed unorthodox location.
- (6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the subject pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That an unorthodox gas well location for the Pennsylvanian formation is hereby approved for a well to be located at a point 990 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the Bast line of Section 7, Township 15 South, Range 28 East, NMPM, Buffalo Valley-Pennsylvanian Gas Pool, Chaves County, New Mexico.
- (2) That the <u>5</u> of said Section 7 shall be dedicated to the above-described well.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
