MR. NUTTER: The witness is still under oath.

MR. TULLY: Again I will hand you the exhibits before we get started.

May it please the Commission, I'm Richard Tully, general counsel for Dugan Production and again there is one witness to call in this case, Thomas A. Dugan.

THOMAS A. DUGAN

called as a witness, having been previously sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. TULLY:

- Q Please state for the record your name?
- A. Thomas A. Dugan.
- Q Address?
 - A. 907 Hallett Circle, Farmington, New Mexico.
- 22 Q. Occupation?
 - A. I'm a petroleum engineer and President of Dugan Production Corporation.

MR. TULLY: Are the witness' qualifications acceptable?

MR. NUTTER: Yes, they are.

Q (Mr. Tully continuing.) I'll hand you the application for this case and ask you to identify it, please?

- A. Yes, this is the application that we sent to the Commission requesting this hearing.
 - Q And the purpose of this application?
- A. The purpose of the application was to seek approval of the drilling of the Sherman Edward 2A Well which deviates from Blanco Mesaverde Pool rules.
 - Q Are these Special Pool Rules 2-A and 2-B?
 - A. Yes.
- Q Now, referring to Exhibit Number One, would you identify it, please?
- A. Exhibit One is merely a map showing the location of the Sherman Edward 2A Well and also showing that there are two Federal leases involved in Section 3, Township 29 North, Range 5 West. The south half is one lease and the north half is another lease.

When we started to plan to drill the wells in Section 3 we felt that it would be most practical to dedicate the west half of Section 3 to form a proration unit and so that is what we proceeded to do and named the well the Sherman Edward No. 2 and then a Sherman Edward 2A for an alternate well in the northwest quarter of Section 3.

Q Have there been other wells drilled in this section?

Were both of these wells Blanco Mesaverde wells?

Yes, they were both Blanco Mesaverde tests.

These two Federal leases that are involved in Section 3 is Dugan Production Corporation the operator and lessee of record?

Yes.

plugged and abandoned.

Of both of these?

Yes, of both leases.

Referring now to Exhibit Number Two, would you identify it, please?

Exhibit Two is a topo map of Section 3 showing that it's cut by La Jara wash and it is pretty rough terrain in the area and it was necessary for us to get approval for an unorthodox location for both of the wells.

By unorthodox location do you mean on a footage basis?

Yes. A.

And not an exception to a Special Pool Rule?

That's correct. Yeah, we secured approval from the Commission for an unorthodox location because of topography

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and we were still operating under the idea that we were going to dedicate the west half of Section 3 as a proration unit.

- Now, referring to Exhibit Number Three, would you identify it, please?
- Okay, this is a letter from the U.S.G.S., Carl Traywick, and he denied us the chance to dedicate the west half because he says that inasmuch as the Mesaverde spacing is three hundred and twenty acres and that each lease contains approximately that amount of acres that the U.S.G.S. will not allow us to dedicate the west half and we must dedicate the south half and north half as the proration So with this it turns out that the 2A then deviates from the pool rules because the first well is supposed to be 12 drilled in the northeast quarter of Section 3.
 - Do you have any other information you feel is relevant to the Commission in the deciding of this application?
 - Well, we didn't feel that it would be a very good venture to drill in the northeast quarter of Section 3 because of the dry hole up there and besides that we were pretty far along by the time we had received the ruling from Traywick, under the idea that we were dedicating the west half. We had already started things in motion to drill the wells, so we did.
 - In your opinion will the approval of this application

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conserve the natural resources of the State of New Mexico, prevent waste and not impair or interfere with the correlative rights of any other owners in this area?

A. The State of New Mexico and Tom Dugan.

MR. TULLY: At this time I move the introduction of Exhibits One through Three into evidence.

MR. NUTTER: Dugan's Exhibits One through Three will be admitted into evidence.

(THEREUPON, Dugan's Exhibits One through Three were admitted into evidence.)
MR. TULLY: I have nothing further.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

- Q Mr. Dugan, the No. 2 Well in the southwest quarter is on pattern but it was unorthodox with respect to footage from the lease lines, is that correct?
- A. Yes, that's right.
- 0. And so you were able to obtain administrative approva
 - A. Yes, sir.
- But the No. 2A is not only unorthodox with respect
 to footage but also off pattern, so to speak?
- A. Yeah, when we staked it and planned the well, it was planned as an infield one hundred and sixty acre -- the second

well on three-twenty so it wasn't deviating from the pool rules.

- Q But now since you are dedicating the north half and the south half each well is on its own three-twenty and it's off-pattern?
 - A. Yes, that's correct.
 - Q Have both wells been completed?
 - A Yes, that's correct.
- Q What is the potential on each of those wells, Mr. Dugan?
- A. Both wells are dually completed in the Mesaverde and the Pictured Cliffs formations. The Sherman Edward 2A Well had a COF in the P.C. of four hundred and eighty-one MCF and in the Mesaverde of one, oh, nine, nine. We have just now completed testing of the Sherman Edward 2 Well and to don't have that information available. In fact, Northwest Pipeline tested both of the wells because the wells are dedicated to their pipeline and they tested them to see if they wanted to hook them up and I haven't received the test information from Northwest.
- Q Well, I notice on your Exhibit Number One there is a pipeline to an Aztec well just immediately west, is that the line that will be tied into yours?
- A. I'm sure that's right. Neither well is far from a pipeline.

- (2) That the applicant, Dugan Production Corporation, seeks approval of an unorthodex gas well location for its Sherman Edward Well No. 2A, located 2500 feet from the North line and 510 feet from the West line of Section 3, Township 29 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, to test the Mesaverde formation, Blanco Mesaverde Gas Pool, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

- (4) That a well at said unorthodox location will better enable applicant to produce the gas underlying the proration unit.

- (6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the subject pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.




