ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a. m., on June 16, 1954, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

NOW, on this J day of July, 1954, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the records and testimony adduced, and being fully advised in the premises;

FINDS:

- (1) That due notice of the time and place of hearing and the purpose thereof having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this case and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That pursuant to provisions of Rule 7 (a) of Order No. R-370-A, the Commission has power and authority to permit the formation of a gas proration unit consisting of other than a legal quarter section after notice and hearing by the Commission.
- (3) That applicant, Shell Oil Company, is the owner of an oil and gas lease in Lea County, New Mexico the land consisting of other than a legal quarter section, and described as follows, to-wit:

TOWNSHIP 19 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM. NE/4 SE/4 of Section 29

containing 40 acres, more or less.

- (4) That applicant, Shell Oil Company, has a producing well on the aforesaid lease known as State "F", No. 1, located 1980' from the South line and 660' from the East line of Section 29, Township 19 South, Range 37 East.
- (5) That the aforesaid well is located within the limits of the pool here-tofore delineated and designated as the Eumont Gas Pool.

- (6) That efforts are being made to communitize the above described 40 acres with other lease owners in the SE/4 of Section 29 and pending the outcome of such negotiations the aforementioned unorthodox unit should be approved.
- (7) That unless a proration unit consisting of applicant's aforesaid acreage is permitted, applicant will be deprived of the opportunity to recover its just and equitable share of the natural gas in the Eumont Gas Pool.
- (8) That creation of a proration unit consisting of the aforesaid acreage will not cause but will prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the application of Shell Oil Company for approval of an unorthodox proration unit consisting of the following described acreage

TOWNSHIP 19 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM. NE/4 SE/4 of Section 29

be and the same is hereby approved, and a proration unit consisting of aforesaid acreage is hereby created.

(2) That applicant's well, State "F", No. 1, located in the NE/4 SE/4 of Section 29, Township 19 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, shall be granted an allowable in the proportion that the above described 40 acre unit bears to the standard or orthodox proration unit for said pool, all until further order of the Commission.

this unit shall consist of the northeast fourth, southeast fourth, Section 29, Township 19 South, manne 37 Wast, Lea County, Law Lexico, as outlined in rea. Other wells hithis vicinity in the Eumont Gas Pool are also shown in red on the plat. Shall State F-1 was originally completed duly 16, 1936 as a Graybury-San Andres producer. Permission to dually complete this well in the Eumont Gas Pool and Londont Cil Pool was granted by the Oil Conservation Commission in Order K-224, dated December 12, 1952. This well was completed as a Eumont gas, Monument Oil dual well, January 4, 1953, for a calculated absolute open-flow potential of 2.6 million cubic feet per day.

Discussions looking into the unitization of the gas horizon in the quarter section have been initiated with Gulf, which hold the remaining acresse therein.

Presently we are studying several plans under which unitization might best be handled under this specific case. Meanwhile we request that the propation unit as proposed be granted in order that Shell State F-1 may continue to carry at allowable.



Gentlemen:

Shell Oil Company respectfully submits application for an unorthodox gas proration unit for its State F-1 well in the Eumont Gas Pool. Further, it is requested that this matter be considered at the next regular statewide hearing on June 16, 1954.

The following data is offered in support of this application:

- 1. Shell Oil Company is the owner and operator of the 1000acre State (B-1167) lease which includes the NE/4 SE/4 of Section 29, T-19-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico, as shown on the attached plat.
- 2. Shell Oil Company proposes that the above described acreage be established as an unorthodox 40-acre gas proration unit in exception to Rule 7 (a) of Order R-370A.
- 3. Shell State F-1, located 1960 feet from the south line and 660 feet from the east line of Section 29, T-19-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico, was completed as a Eumont (gas) - Monument (oil) dual well January 4, 1953. Permission to dually complete this well in the Eumont Gas Pool and the Monument Pool was granted by the Oil Conservation Commission in Order R-224 dated December 12, 1952.
- 4. No other Eumont gas well is completed on the 40-acre proration unit proposed under this application.
