Dear Sir:

Application is hereby made for an exception to Rule 506 for the above captioned well.

This well was originally completed as an oil well on Dec. 29, 1956 at a total depth of 3700' in the Grayburg formation. The well was produced from that depth until Feb. 26, 1947 when drilling was resumed to deepen it to 6470'. It was recompleted as an oil well in the Drinkard zone on April 21, 1947. During this deepening operation the following Drill Stem Tests were taken in the Paddock zone which was topped at 4995'.

D.S.T. 4985-5060: Gas to surface in 2 min. with flow estimated at 8,000 MCF/day. Shut in pressure 1975 psi. Recovery 20' mud and distillate with SW.

D.S.T. 5046-5109: Gas to surface in 3 min. Flowed 5 bl. oil and 5 bl. SW in 1 hr. Shut in pressure 1850 psi.

D.S.T. 5116-5158: Gas to surface in 2 min. Shut in pressure 1900 psi. Recovery 30' oil, 210' oil cut mud, and 60' SW.

Due to an excessive Gas-O11 Ratio this well was subsequently penalized to 6 bbl. per day. On March 24, 1951, a bridging plug was set at 5140' to shut off the Drinkard zone and well was perforated at 5100-5105' and recompleted as a gas well in the Paddock zone. The present shut in pressure is 1705 psi and the well has been tested at 7500 MCF per day.

Although this well is located but 330' south of the defined limits of the Paddock pool it is our belief that it is in anglesolated 180al-ized gas reservoir that is separate and not connected with the oil

reservoir of the Paddock pool. Our reasons for this contention are as follows:

- l. Although the average producing depth of the entire Paddock pool is 5180', the nearest Paddock pool wells on Gulf Oil Corp.'s Hugh lease (Ng-14-22-37), are producing from 5030' and 5017' which indicates that the top of the oil zone slopes upward to the south. This is borne out by the fact that Sinclair's Boyd No. 2 encountered the top of the Paddock formation at 4995'.
- 2. Examination of records of Drinkard pool wells drilled on Samedan Oil Corporation's Parks lease (S1-14-22-37) which is immediately north of Sinclair's Boyd lease, did not reveal any pays or shows in the Paddock zone. This suggests that there is a discontinuity of production in the Paddock zone between the Paddock pool proper and Sinclair's Boyd No. 2.
- 3. The average Bottom Hole Pressure for the south portion of the Paddock pool, as reported in New Mexico Oil and Gas Engineering Committee's Engineering Report for September, 1950, is 1340 psi, whereas the shut in pressure of Sinclair's Boyd No. 2 is 1705 psi. The average B.H.P. for the entire Paddock pool is 1299 psi and the B.H.P. map shows a rather uniform pressure distribution which indicates good continuity to all portions of the pool. The excess B.H.P. found in Sinclair's Boyd No. 2 further substantiates the concention that it is is a separate reservoir.

In view of the foregoing it is our opinion that the production of gas from Sinclair's Ollie Boyd No. 2 gas well, would not effect the ultimate recovery of oil from wells in the Paddock pool. With this belief we respectfully request that this well be granted an exception to Rule 506.
