ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter came on regularly for hearing at 10 o'clock A. M. on June 21, 1951, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

NOW, on this 19th day of July, 1951, the Commission having before it the evidence presented at said hearing, and being fully advised in the premises:

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of the subject matter and of the interested parties.
- (2) That inspection of the location by a representative of the Commission discloses that the well-bore as of May 15, 1951, was not plugged, although the premises and pits clearly show long abandonment, and for the prevention of underground waste and for location cleanup, the well-bore should be plugged as required by the Rules and Regulations of the Commission.
- (3) That O. L. Ledgerwood, Pauls Valley, Oklahoma; E. L. Kimes, Route 4, Tucumcari, New Mexico; Accident and Casualty Company, New York, New York, c/o Nathan R. Bell, Resident Agent, Tucumcari, New Mexico; or any other person asserting any interest, right, title, daim or demand in or to said well-bore made no appearance in the case, although properly served in accordance with the law and Rules and Regulations of the Commission.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

(1) That O. L. Ledgerwood, E. L. Kimes, Accident and Casualty Company, New York, New York, c/o Nathan R. Bell, Tucumcari and all persons claiming any right, title, or interest in or to that certain well-bore located upon SE/4 SE/4 of Section II, Township 12 N, Range 32 E, NMPM, Quay County, New Mexico, are hereby declared to be in default;

(2) That said well-bore upon SE/4 SE/4 Section II, Township 12 N, Range 32 E, NMPM, is hereby declared abandoned and shall be plugged in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Commission; provided however, that O. L. Ledgerwood, E. L. Kimes and/or any person claiming any right, title or interest in or to said well-bore may have thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of this order within which to retrieve recoverable material from said well-bore if any there be, and to properly plug said well-bore in accordance with the rules of this Commission and clean up the premises; failure hereunder within the time specified herein shall require the calling upon the surety company, Accident and Casualty Company of New York, New York, c/o Nathan R. Bell, resident agent to, at its own expense, immediately plug the said well-bore in compliance with the Rules and Regulations of this Commission





Gentlemen:

On June 21, 1951, the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission entered its Order No. R-81 in Case No. 280 directed to O. L. Ledgerwood, E. L. Kimes and the Accident and Casualty Company of New York declaring them in default in failing to plug the O. L. Your letter of September 15, 1951, to Mr. R. R. Spurrier has been referred to me for an answer.

while I can appreciate Mr. John Kelly's concern in regards to his water well near the above captioned well, I do not believe that he need be concerned insofar as the plugging of this well is concerned. Briefly, the situation is this: We have at hand cementing tickets from the Halliburton Oil Well Cementing Company, stating exactly how this well was cemented. These in effect, state that 202' of 13 3/8" was cemented circulating the cement to the surface and that 1660' of 9 5/8" was also circulated to the surface with 525 sax. This I am sure, renders this casing immovable. The hole was then plugged back with cement to a total depth of 1680'. This leaves 20' of open hole. Our plugging program for this well will entail no shooting, but merely the cementing of the 20' of open hole plus an additional 20' up into the 9 5/8" casing. This will adequately protect all water and mineral zones from flooding or contamination. The surface of the casing will have a 15' cement plug with a 4" x 4' steel marker to mark the location of the well bore. The pits will be levelled off and covered. I believe you can see that there is positively no danger of contaminating or damaging Mr. Kelly's water well by using this procedure plus the fact that it will eliminate the danger that might be involved in leaving the pits open.

As you probably know, Order #R-81, gave Mr. Ledgerwood thirty (30) days in which to accomplish the above process. Since no word has been received from Mr. Ledgerwood, we are today advising the surety company to fulfil our requirements.

Mr. John Kelly, address Nara Visa, New Mexico, has discussed with me your Order, dated July 19, 1951, in your Case No. 280, Order No. R-81, with regard to the plugging of a well in the

SEASE of Sec. 11, Township 12 N., Range 32 E., N.H.P.M.

In December, 1950, Mr. Kelly purchased from E. L. Kimes the land on which this well is located along with other land adjoining.

Mr. Kelly has a water well about 50 feet north and 25 feet west of the well to be plugged. His water well is a good well and is valuable in the area. He fears that in removing casing from the well for oil, the operators may explode a charge in the well for oil which will adversely affect his water well.

We are calling this situation to your attention as you, no doubt, know more than Mr. Kelly or I as to what damage might result to his water well from an explosion in this well for oil. We trust you will take any steps that may be necessary and appropriate to protect his water well.

Mr. Kelly would, no doubt, have a claim against the operators and surety company if his water well should be damaged but, naturally, he is anxious to avoid any trouble and expense in the matter.

Another situation about which Mr. Kelly is concerned is that he is informed there may be poisonous substance in the slush pit

INSPECTION REPORT

May 15, 1951

Ledgerwood - Kimes No. 1 SESE Section 11, T. 12N, R. 32, Cuay County, New Mexico.

This location was inspected this date and the report is as follows:

Small cellar approximately 4 feet square and framed 3xl2 surrounded what I assumed to be the well bore. There was no sign of casing or markers. All pits which total 3 were open and no apparent attempt has been made to cover them. The usual amount of tires, cables, thread protectors, etc., were strewn about the location.

On my last inspection I was under the impression that the top of the casing was visible, but since there was considerable mud in the cellar I did not attempt to probe into it to find the casing as I was sure that the hole has not been plugged.

In my conversation with Mr. Felix Hauser he stated that 13" conductor pipe was set 198 feet and 1660 feet of 9 5/8 was cemented with 525 sx by Halliburton of Oklahoma. I am writing Halliburton of the work done on this well. He also informed me that Mr. Ledgerwood resided at Pauls Valley, Oklahoma.

I would recommend that Mr. Ledgerwood be called in for a hearing to show cause why he should not plug and abandon this well.
