ORDER NO. AG-32

GAS PRORATION ORDER FOR PERIOD JULY 1, 1969 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 1969

The Commission held public hearing at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on May 14, 1969, at 9 a.m., pursuant to legal notice, for the purpose of setting the allowable production of gas from the following thirteen gas pools in Lea, Eddy, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, for the six-month period, July 1, 1969 through December 31, 1969.

Atoka-Pennsylvanian, Bagley-Lower Pennsylvanian, Bagley-Upper Pennsylvanian, Blinebry, Crosby-Devonian, Eumont, Indian Basin-Morrow, Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian, Jalmat, Justis, Monument McKee-Ellenburger, Todd-Lower San Andres, and Tubb.

NOW, on this <u>15th</u> day of <u>May, 1969</u>, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the nominations of purchasers, the capacity of producing wells, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises,

## FINDS:

(1) That the total nomination of purchasers of gas produced from the above-listed thirteen gas pools for the period, July 1, 1969, through December 31, 1969, is 115,054,108 Mcf. The individual pool nominations are as follows:

(2) That the potential producing capacity of all gas wells in the thirteen gas pools listed above is in excess of the nominations of purchasers of gas, and in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights, the production of gas from the above-listed thirteen gas pools should be limited, allocated, and distributed during the six-month proration period commencing July 1, 1969.

(3) That all the producing gas wells, together with the expected completed or recompleted wells in the thirteen gas pools listed above, can produce a total of 115,054,108 Mcf without causing waste within the six-month proration period commencing July 1, 1969, and an allocation based upon such production would be reasonable and would protect correlative rights. -2-ORDER NO. IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That for the six-month proration period commencing July 1, 1969, the total allowable production to be assigned the thirteen allocated gas pools in Lea, Eddy, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, is as follows:

(2) That the allocation hereby set for said six-month proration period in the thirteen allocated pools in Lea, Eddy, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, shall be in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

(3) That the total allowable production for each pool shall be allocated on a monthly basis and shall be adjusted monthly to meet changes in market conditions as reflected by purchasers' supplemental nominations and actual gas production, in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

The foregoing order shall remain effective until further order of the Commission.
