ORDER NO. AG-42-7

SUPPLEMENTAL GAS PRORATION ORDER FOR THE MONTH  
OF OCTOBER, 1977

This cause came on for public hearing by the Commission's Examiner, Richard L. Stamets, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on September 14, 1977, at 9 a.m., pursuant to legal notice for the purpose of setting the allowable production of gas from the following fifteen gas pools in Lea, Eddy, Chaves, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, for the month of October, 1977.

Atoka-Pennsylvanian, Blinebry, Buffalo Valley-Pennsylvanian, Burton Flats-Morrow, Burton Flats-Strawn, Carlsbad-Morrow South, Catclaw Draw-Morrow, Crosby-Devonian, Eumont, Indian Basin-Morrow, Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian, Jalmat, Justis, Monument McKee-Ellenburger, and Tubb.

NOW, on this 20th day of September, 1977, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the supplemental nominations of purchasers, the capacity of producing wells, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That the total nomination of purchasers of gas produced from the above-listed fifteen gas pools for the month of October, 1977, is 25,061,748 Mcf. The individual pool nominations are as follows:

Jalmat	2,210,100 Mcf
Justis	144,100 Mcf
Monument McKee-Ellenburger	264,700 Mcf
Tubb	1,355,300 Mcf

(2) That the potential producing capacity of all gas wells in the fifteen gas pools listed above is in excess of the nominations of purchasers of gas, and in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights, the production of gas from the listed fifteen gas pools should be limited, allocated, and distributed during the month of October, 1977.

(3) That all the producing gas wells, together with the expected completed or recompleted wells in the fifteen gas pools listed above, can produce a total of 25,061,748 Mcf without causing waste during the month of October, 1977, and an allocation based upon such production would be reasonable and would protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That for the month of October, 1977, the allowable production to be assigned the fifteen allocated gas pools in Lea, Eddy, Chaves, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, is as follows:

(2) That the allocation hereby set for the month of October, 1977, in the fifteen allocated pools in Lea, Eddy, Chaves, and Roosevelt Counties, New Mexico, shall be in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

(3) That a proration schedule, duly prepared by the Commission and thereafter adopted for the month of October, 1977, is hereto attached and made a part hereof; it distributes and allocates the allowable production among the gas wells in the fifteen gas pools listed above for the period stated, in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

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
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
The foregoing order shall remain effective until further order of the Commission.
