## SUPPLEMENTAL GAS PRORATION ORDER FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1984

This cause came on for public hearing before the Division's Examiner, Michael E. Stogner, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, at 8 a.m. on December 15, 1983, pursuant to legal notice for the purpose of setting the allowable production of gas from the following four gas pools in San Juan, Rio Arriba, and Sandoval Counties, New Mexico, for the month of January, 1984:

Basin-Dakota, Blanco-Mesaverde, Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South, and Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs.

NOW, on this <u>15th</u> day of December, 1983, the Division Director, having considered the supplemental nominations of purchasers, the capacity of producing wells, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That the total nomination of purchasers of gas produced from the above-listed four gas pools for the month of January, 1984, is 30,795,600 Mcf. The individual pool nominations are as follows:

Basin-Dakota	13,195,000	Mcf
Blanco-Mesaverde	15,613,600	Mcf
Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South	1,662,500	Mcf
Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs	324,500	Mcf

(2) That the potential producing capacity of all gas wells in the four gas pools listed above is in excess of the nominations of purchasers of gas, and in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights, the production of gas from the above-listed four gas pools should be limited, allocated, and distributed during the month of January, 1984.

(3) That all the producing gas wells, together with the expected completed or recompleted wells in the four gas pools listed above, can produce a total of 30,795,600 Mcf without causing waste during the month of January, 1984, and an allocation based upon such production would be reasonable and would protect correlative rights.

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## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That for the month of January, 1984, the allowable production to be assigned the four allocated gas pools in San Juan, Rio Arriba, and Sandoval Counties, New Mexico, is as follows:

Basin-Dakota	13,195,000 Mcf
Blanco-Mesaverde	15,613,600 Mcf
Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South	1,662,500 Mcf
Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs	324,500 Mcf

(2) That the allocation hereby set for the month of January, 1984, in the four allocated pools in San Juan, Rio Arriba, and Sandoval Counties, New Mexico, shall be in accordance with the Division Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

(3) That a proration schedule, duly prepared by the Division and thereafter adopted for the month of January, 1984, is hereto attached and made a part hereof; it distributes and allocates the allowable production among the gas wells in the four gas pools listed above for the period stated, in accordance with the Division Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

The foregoing order shall remain effective until further order of the Division.
