**APPLICATION OF BURLINGTON RESOURCES OIL & GAS COMPANY, L.P.  
FOR COMPULSORY POOLING, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.**

**ORDER OF THE DIVISION**

**BY THE DIVISION:**

This case came on for hearing at 8:15 a.m. on May 30, 2002, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner David K. Brooks.

NOW, on this 17th day of June, 2002, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record and the recommendations of the Examiner,

**FINDS THAT:**

(1) Due public notice has been given, and the Division has jurisdiction of this case and of the subject matter.

(2) Burlington Resources Oil & Gas Company, L.P., ("Applicant"), seeks an order pooling all uncommitted mineral interests in the Mesaverde formation only underlying the N/2 of Section 18, Township 30 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in the following manner:

The N/2, forming a standard 325.92-acre gas spacing and proration unit (the "Unit") for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

(3) The above-described unit (the "Unit") is to be dedicated to Applicant's James Scott Well No. 1 (**API No. 30-045-09562**), an existing Dakota well located at a standard gas well location within the NE/4 NE/4 (Unit A) of Section 18, which Applicant proposes to reenter and recomplete in the Mesaverde formation. The exact location of this well is 1050 feet from the North line and 1190 feet from the East line of Section 18.

(4) Two or more separately owned tracts are embraced within the Unit, and/or there are royalty interests and/or undivided interests in oil and gas minerals in one or more tracts included in the Unit that are separately owned.

(5) Applicant is an owner of an oil and gas working interest within the Unit. Applicant has the right to drill a well to a common source of supply within the Unit, or to recomplete the existing James Scott Well No. 1 as proposed.

(6) There are interest owners in the proposed unit that have not agreed to pool their interests.

(7) To avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, protect correlative rights, prevent waste and afford to the owner of each interest in the Unit the opportunity to recover or receive without unnecessary expense its just and fair share of hydrocarbons, this application should be approved by pooling all uncommitted interests, whatever they may be, in the oil and gas within the Unit.

(8) Applicant should be designated the operator of the proposed well and of the Unit.

(9) Applicant requested that a risk penalty of 200 percent be assessed against any non-consenting working interest owner.

(10) Inasmuch as the subject well has already been drilled, the remaining risk applies only to reentry and recompletion operations to be conducted on the well. Based on precedent established in previous compulsory pooling cases involving the reentry of existing wellbores, the risk penalty should be fixed at 100%.

(11) Any non-consenting working interest owner who does not pay its share of estimated well costs should have withheld from production its share of reasonable well costs plus an additional 100% thereof as a reasonable charge for the risk involved in reentering and recompleting the well.

(12) Reasonable charges for supervision (combined fixed rates) should be fixed at \$5,406 per month while drilling and \$540.60 per month while producing, provided that these rates should be adjusted annually pursuant to Section III.1.A.3. of the COPAS form titled "*Accounting Procedure-Joint Operations*." The operator should be authorized to withhold from production the proportionate share of both the supervision charges and the actual expenditures required for operating the well, not in excess of what are reasonable, attributable to each non-consenting working interest.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

(1) Pursuant to the application of Burlington Resources Oil & Gas Company, L.P., all uncommitted interests, whatever they may be, in the oil and gas in the Mesaverde formation only underlying the N/2 of Section 18, Township 30 North, Range 11 West, N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico, are hereby pooled, as follows:

The N/2, forming a standard 325.92-acre gas spacing and proration unit for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

The Unit shall be dedicated to Applicant's James Scott Well No. 1 (**API No. 30-045-09562**), an existing Dakota well (the "well") located at a standard gas well location within the NE/4 NE/4 (Unit A) of Section 18, which Applicant proposes to reenter and recomplete in the Mesaverde formation. The exact location of this well is 1050 feet from the North line and 1190 feet from the East line of Section 18.

(2) The operator of the Unit shall commence reentry of the well on or before September 30, 2002, and shall thereafter continue operations with due diligence to test the Mesaverde formation.

(3) In the event the operator does not commence reentry of the well on or before September 30, 2002, Ordering Paragraph (1) shall be of no effect, unless the operator obtains a time extension from the Division Director for good cause.

(4) Should the proposed well not be completed in the Mesaverde formation, or be abandoned, within 120 days after commencement thereof, the operator shall appear before the Division Director and show cause why Ordering Paragraph (1) should not be rescinded.

(5) Applicant is hereby designated the operator of the proposed well and of the Unit.

(6) After pooling, uncommitted working interest owners are referred to as non-consenting working interest owners. ("Uncommitted working interest owners" are owners of working interests in the Unit, including unleased mineral interests, who are not parties to an operating agreement governing the Unit.) After the effective date of this order, the operator shall furnish the Division and each known non-consenting working interest owner in the Unit an itemized schedule of estimated well costs of the proposed well.

(7) Within 30 days from the date the schedule of estimated well costs is furnished, any non-consenting working interest owner shall have the right to pay its share of estimated well costs to the operator in lieu of paying its share of reasonable well costs out of production as hereinafter provided, and any such owner who pays its share of estimated well costs as provided above shall remain liable for operating costs but shall not be liable for risk charges.

(8) The operator shall furnish the Division and each known non-consenting working interest owner an itemized schedule of actual well costs within 90 days following completion of the proposed well. If no objection to the actual well costs is received by the Division, and the Division has not objected, within 45 days following receipt of the schedule, the actual well costs shall be deemed to be the reasonable well costs. If there is an objection to actual well costs within the 45-day period, the Division will determine reasonable well costs after public notice and hearing.

(9) Within 60 days following determination of reasonable well costs, any non-consenting working interest owner who has paid its share of estimated costs in advance as provided above shall pay to the operator its share of the amount that reasonable well costs exceed estimated well costs and shall receive from the operator its share of the amount that paid, estimated well costs exceed reasonable well costs.

(10) The operator is hereby authorized to withhold the following costs and charges from production:

- (a) the proportionate share of reasonable well costs attributable to each non-consenting working interest owner who has not paid its share of estimated well costs within 30 days from the date the schedule of estimated well costs is furnished; and
- (b) as a charge for the risk involved in reentering and recompleting the well, 100% of the above costs.

(11) The operator shall distribute the costs and charges withheld from production, proportionately, to the parties who advanced the well costs.

(12) Reasonable charges for supervision (combined fixed rates) are hereby fixed at \$5,406 per month while drilling and \$540.60 per month while producing, provided that these rates shall be adjusted annually pursuant to Section III.1.A.3. of the COPAS form titled "*Accounting Procedure-Joint Operations*." The operator is authorized to withhold from production the proportionate share of both the supervision

charges and the actual expenditures required for operating the well, not in excess of what is reasonable, attributable to each non-consenting working interest.

(13) Except as provided in Ordering Paragraphs (10) and (12) above, all proceeds from production from the well that are not disbursed for any reason shall be placed in escrow in San Juan County, New Mexico, to be paid to the true owner thereof upon demand and proof of ownership. The operator shall notify the Division of the name and address of the escrow agent within 30 days from the date of first deposit with the escrow agent.


(14) Any unleased mineral interest shall be considered a seven-eighths (7/8) working interest and a one-eighth (1/8) royalty interest for the purpose of allocating costs and charges under this order. Any well costs or charges that are to be paid out of production shall be withheld only from the working interests' share of production, and no costs or charges shall be withheld from production attributable to royalty interests.

(15) Should all the parties to this compulsory pooling order reach voluntary agreement subsequent to entry of this order, this order shall thereafter be of no further effect.

(16) The operator of the well and Unit shall notify the Division in writing of the subsequent voluntary agreement of all parties subject to the forced pooling provisions of this order.


(17) Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
