ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on February 26, 1969, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Elvis A. Utz.

NOW, on this <u>14th</u> day of March, 1969, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant, Sidney Lanier, is the owner and operator of the I. B. Ogg "A" Well No. 5, located in Unit J of Section 35, Township 24 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Jalmat Yates-Seven Rivers Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

(3) That the applicant proposes to utilize said well to dispose of produced salt water into the Seven Rivers formation, with injection into the open-hole interval from approximately 3404 feet to 3532 feet.

(4) That the injection should be accomplished through 3-inch plastic-lined tubing installed in a packer set at approximately 3390 feet and that a hydrostatically balanced column of inert fluid should be maintained in the casing-tubing annulus.

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(5) That approval of the subject application will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells and otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the applicant, Sidney Lanier, is hereby authorized to utilize his I. B. Ogg "A" Well No. 5, located in Unit J of Section 35, Township 24 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Jalmat Yates-Seven Rivers Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, to dispose of produced salt water into the Seven Rivers formation, injection to be accomplished through 3-inch tubing installed in a packer set at approximately 3390 feet, with injection into the open-hole interval from approximately 3404 feet to 3532 feet;

<u>PROVIDED HOWEVER</u>, that the tubing shall be plastic-lined and that a hydrostatically balanced column of inert fluid shall be maintained in the casing-tubing annulus.

(2) That the applicant shall submit monthly reports of his disposal operations in accordance with Rules 704 and 1120 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

(3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
