ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9:00 a.m. on November 17, 1971, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Elvis A. Utz.

NOW, on this 19th day of November, 1971, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That there is need for the creation of a new oil pool in Lea County, New Mexico, for the production of oil from the Drinkard formation, said pool to bear the designation of Garrett-Drinkard Pool. Said Garrett-Drinkard Pool was discovered by the Green & Michaelson Producing Company Burson Well No. 1, located in Unit C of Section 28, Township 16 South, Range 38 East, NMPM. It was completed in the Drinkard formation on August 18, 1971. The top of the perforations is at 8,189 feet.

(3) That there is need for certain extensions to the Justis Tubb-Drinkard Pool, the Vacuum-Abo Reef Pool, and the

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North Vacuum-Abo Pool, all in Lea County, New Mexico, and the Vada-Pennsylvanian Pool in Roosevelt County, New Mexico.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(a) That a new pool in Lea County, New Mexico, classified as an oil pool for Drinkard production, is hereby created and designated as the Garrett-Drinkard Pool, consisting of the following described area:

TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 38 EAST, NMPM
Section 28: NW/4

(b) That the Justis Tubb-Drinkard Pool in Lea County, New Mexico, as heretofore classified, defined, and described, is hereby extended to include therein:

TOWNSHIP 25 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM
Section 12: SE/4

(c) That the Vacuum-Abo Reef Pool in Lea County, New Mexico, as heretofore classified, defined, and described, is hereby extended to include therein:

TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 36 EAST, NMPM
Section 18: S/2

(d) That the North Vacuum-Abo Pool in Lea County, New Mexico, as heretofore classified, defined, and described, is hereby extended to include therein:

TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 34 EAST, NMPM
Section 15: NE/4 and N/2 SE/4
Section 27: NW/4
Section 28: E/2

TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 35 EAST, NMPM
Section 19: SW/4

(e) That the Vada-Pennsylvanian Pool in Roosevelt County, New Mexico, as heretofore classified, defined, and described, is hereby extended to include therein:

TOWNSHIP 8 SOUTH, RANGE 34 EAST, NMPM
Section 35: SW/4

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
IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

(1) That, pursuant to Section 65-3-14.5, NMSA 1953, contained in Chapter 271, Laws of 1969, any well which, by virtue of any of the above pool extensions, is subject to pool rules providing for spacing or proration units larger than the one which is presently dedicated thereto, shall have 60 days from the effective date of this order in which to file new Forms C-102 dedicating a standard unit for the pool to said well, or to obtain a non-standard unit approved by the Commission. Pending such compliance, the well shall receive a maximum allowable in the same proportion to a standard allowable for the pool that the acreage dedicated to the well bears to a standard unit for the pool. Failure to file Forms C-102 dedicating a standard unit to the well or to obtain a non-standard unit approved by the Commission within said 60-day period shall subject the well to cancellation of allowable.


(2) That the effective date of this order and all creations and extensions included herein shall be December 1, 1971.
