Harvest Four Corners, LLC hereby provides notification of two major wastewater releases that occurred on 8/1/2022

- Middle Mesa CDP, estimated 72 bbl release, 36.9078599, -107.561754
- 32-8#2 CDP, estimated 88 bbl release, 36.95707, -107.66326

Due to heavy rainfall, wastewater tanks overflowed into lined secondary containments. No liquids were released outside of the containments. For background, wastewater is rainfall that has mixed with small amounts of contaminants on the engine skids (lube oil, grease, etc.). The mixture is not considered to be toxic. Harvest will be removing the liquids from these containments today. Harvest plans to complete the liner inspections required by 19.15.29.11.A.5.a. on 8/3/2022. If you have any questions or concerns, please let me know. Thanks again for your help this morning.
