PREVIOUS OPERATOR certifies that all below-grade tanks constructed and installed prior to June 16, 2008 associated with the selected wells being transferred are either (1) in compliance with 19.15.17 NMAC, (2) have been closed pursuant to 19.15.17.13 NMAC or (3) have been retrofitted to comply with Paragraphs 1 through 4 of 19.15.17.11(I) NMAC.

FOUNDATION ENERGY MANAGEMENT, LLC understands that the OCD's approval of this operator change:

- 1. constitutes approval of the transfer of the permit for any permitted pit, below-grade tank or closed-loop system associated with the selected wells; and
- 2. constitutes approval of the transfer of any below-grade tanks constructed and installed prior to June 16, 2008 associated with the selected wells, regardless of whether the transferor has disclosed the existence of those below-grade tanks to the transferee or to the OCD, and regardless of whether the below-grade tanks are in compliance with 19.15.17 NMAC.

As the operator of record of wells in New Mexico, FOUNDATION ENERGY MANAGEMENT, LLC agrees to the following statements:

- 1. I am responsible for ensuring that the wells and related facilities comply with applicable statutes and rules, and am responsible for all regulatory filings with the OCD. I have familiarized myself with all applicable statutes and rules, not just the rules referenced in this list. - I understand that if I acquire wells from another operator, the OCD must approve the operator change before I begin operating those
 wells, see 19.15.9.9(3) NMAC. I understand that if I acquire wells or facilities subject to a compliance order addressing inactive wells or
 environmental cleanup, before the OCD will approve the operator change it may require me to enter into an enforceable agreement to

- I must file a monthly C-115 report showing production for each non-plugged well completion for which the OCD has approved an
 allowable and authorization to transport, and injection for each injection well. See 19.15.7.24 NMAC. I understand that the OCD may
 cancel my authority to transport from or inject into all the wells I operate if I fail to file C-115 reports. See 19.15.7.24(C) NMAC.
- 4. LUNDERSTAND THAT New Mexico requires wells that have been inactive for certain time periods to be plugged or placed on approved temporary abandonment. See 19.15.25.8 NMAC. I understand the requirements for plugging and approved temporary abandonment in 19.15.25 NMAC. I understand that I can check my compilance with the basic requirements of 19.15.25.8 NMAC by using the "inactive Well List" on OCD's website.
- 5. I must keep current with financial assurances for well plugging. I understand that New Mexico requires each state or fee well that has been inactive for more than two years and has not been plugged and released to be covered by a single-well financial assurance, or blanket plugging financial assurance for wells in temporarity abandoned status, even if the well is also covered by a blanket financial assurance and even if the well is on approved temporary abandonment status. See 19.15.8.9(C) NMAC. I understand that I can check my compliance with the single-well financial assurance requirement by using the "Inactive Well Additional Financial Assurance Report" on the
- I am responsible for reporting releases as defined by 19.15.29 NMAC. I understand the OCD will look to me as the operator of record to take corrective action for releases at my wells and related facilities, including releases that occurred before I became operator of record.

- 9. I am responsible for providing the OCD with my current address of record and emergency contact information, and I am responsible for updating that information when it changes. See 19.15.9.8.C NMAC. I understand that I can update that information on the OCD's website under "Electronic Permitting."
- 10. If I transfer well operations to another operator, the OCO must approve the change before the new operator can begin operations. See 19.15.9.9(8) NMAC. I remain responsible for the wells and related facilities and all related regulatory fillings until the OCO approves the operator change. I understand that the transfer will not relieve me of responsibility or liability for any act or omission which occurred while operated the wells and related facilities.
