660' FSL & 990' FEL, Section 21, 21S, 37E Lea County, NM / API 30-025-27879

- 1. Hold pre-job safety meeting. Comply with all NMOCD, BLM safety and environmental regulations. Test rig anchors prior to moving in rig if not rigged to base beam.
- 2. Check casing, tubing, and Bradenhead pressures.
- 3. Remove existing piping on casing valve. RU blow lines from casing valves and begin blowing down casing pressure. Kill well as necessary. Ensure well is dead or on a vacuum.
- 4. ND wellhead and NU BOP. Function test BOP.
- 5. P/U 5.5" bit or casing scraper on 2-3/8" work string round trip as deep as possible above top perforation at 3646'.
- 6. P/U 5.5" CR, TIH and set CR at +/- 3596'. Pressure test tubing to 1000 psi. Sting out of CR. Load hole, and pressure test casing to 800 psi. If casing does not test, then spot or tag subsequent plugs as appropriate. POOH w/ tubing.
- 7. RU wireline and run CBL with 500 psi on casing from CR at 3596' to surface to identify TOC. Adjust plugs as necessary for new TOC. Email log copy to

Brandon Powell at <u>Brandon.powell@state.nm.us</u> upon completions of logging operations.

- 8. Rig up to pump cement down tubing. Pump water to establish rate down tubing.
- 9. Circulate wellbore with 9.5 ppg salt gel.

NOTE: All Plugs Include 100% excess outside casing and 50% Excess inside casing

10. Plug 1 (Grayburg Perforations, and Queen Formation Top, 3,596'-3,254', 39 Sacks Type I/II Cement)

Mix 39 sx Type I/II cement and spot a balanced plug inside casing to cover the Grayburg perforations, and Queen formation top.

11. Plug 2 (Yates Formation Tops, 2,820'-2,600', 25 Sacks Type I/II Cement)

Mix 25 sx Type I/II cement and spot a balanced plug inside casing to cover the Yates formation tops.

12. Plug 3 (Anhy Formation Top, 1,250'-1,030', 25 Sacks Type I/II Cement)

Mix 25 sx Type I/II cement and spot a balanced plug inside casing to cover the Anhy formation top.

13. Plug 4 (Surface Casing Shoe, 452'-Surface, 52 Sacks Type I/II Cement)

Attempt to pressure test the bradenhead annulus to 300 psi; note the volume to load. If BH annulus holds pressure, then establish circulation out casing valve with water. Mix approximately 52 sx cement and spot a balanced plug from 452' to surface, circulate good cement out of casing valve. TOOH and LD tubing. Shut well in and WOC. If BH annulus does not test, then perforate at the appropriate depth and attempt to circulate cement to surface filling the casing from 452' and the annulus from the squeeze holes to surface. Shut in well and WOC.

14. ND cementing valves and cut off wellhead. Fill annuli with cement as necessary. Install P&A marker to comply with regulations. Record GPS coordinate for P&A marker on tower report. Photograph P&A marker in place. RD, MOL and restore location per BLM stipulations.

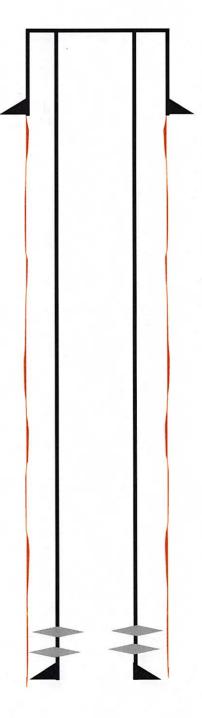

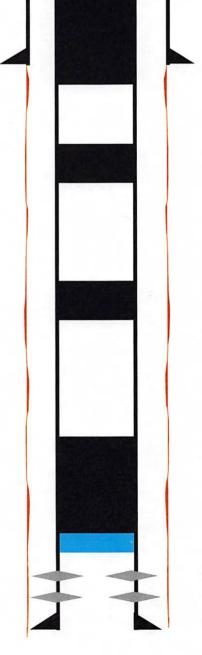

#### CONDITIONS FOR PLUGGING AND ABANDONMENT

#### OCD - Southern District

The following is a guide or checklist in preparation of a plugging program, this is not all inclusive and care must be exercised in establishing special plugging programs in unique and unusual cases, Notify NMOCD District Office II at (575)-748-1283 at least 24 hours before beginning work. After MIRU rig will remain on well until it is plugged to surface. OCD is to be notified before rig down. Company representative will be on location during plugging procedures.

- A notice of intent to plug and abandon a wellbore is required to be approved before plugging
  operations are conducted. A cement evaluation tool is required in order to ensure isolation of
  producing formations, protection of water and correlative rights. A cement bond log or other
  accepted cement evaluation tool is to be provided to the division for evaluation if one has not
  been previously run or if the well did not have cement circulated to surface during the original
  casing cementing job or subsequent cementing jobs. Insure all bradenheads have been
  exposed, identified and valves are operational prior to rig up.
- 2. Closed loop system is to be used for entire plugging operation. Upon completion, contents of steel pits are to be hauled to a permitted disposal location.
- 3. Trucking companies being used to haul oilfield waste fluids to a disposal commercial or private shall have an approved NMOCD C-133 permit. A copy of this permit shall be available in each truck used to haul waste products. It is the responsibility of the operator as well as the contractor, to verify that this permit is in place prior to performing work. Drivers shall be able to produce a copy upon request of an NMOCD Field inspector.
- 4. Filing a subsequent C-103 will serve as notification that the well has been plugged.
- 5. A final C-103 shall be filed (and a site inspection by NMOCD Inspector to determine if the location is satisfactorily cleaned, all equipment, electric poles and trash has been removed to Meet NMOCD standards) before bonding can be released.
- 6. If work has not begun within 1 Year of the approval of this procedure, an extension request must be file stating the reason the well has not been plugged.
- 7. Squeeze pressures are not to exceed 500 psi, unless approval is given by NMOCD.
- 8. Produced water will not be used during any part of the plugging operation.
- 9. Mud laden fluids must be placed between all cement plugs mixed at 25 sacks per 100 bbls of water.
- 10. All cement plugs will be a minimum of 100' in length or a minimum of 25 sacks of cement, whichever is greater. 50' of calculated cement excess required for inside casing plugs and 100% calculated cement excess required on outside casing plugs.
- 11. Class 'C' cement will be used above 7500 feet.
- 12. Class 'H' cement will be used below 7500 feet.
- 13. A cement plug is required to be set 50' above and 50' below, casing stubs, DV tools, attempted casing cut offs, cement tops outside casing, salt sections and anywhere the casing is perforated, these plugs require a 4 hour WOC and then will be tagged
- 14. All Casing Shoes Will Be Perforated 50' below shoe depth and Attempted to be Squeezed, cement needs to be 50' above and 50' Below Casing Shoe inside the Production Casing.

- 16. When setting the top out cement plug in production, intermediate and surface casing, wellbores should remain full at least 30 minutes after plugs are set
- 17. A CIBP is to be set within 100' of production perforations, capped with 100' of cement, WOC 4 hours and tag.
- 18. A CIBP with 35' of cement may be used in lieu of the 100' plug if set with a bailer. This plug will be placed within 100' of the top perforation, (WOC 4 hrs and tag).
- 19. No more than 3000' is allowed between cement plugs in cased hole and 2000' in open hole.
- 20. Some of the Formations to be isolated with cement plugs are: These plugs to be set to isolate formation tops
  - A) Fusselman
  - B) Devonian
  - C) Morrow
  - D) Wolfcamp
  - E) Bone Springs
  - F) Delaware
  - G) Any salt sections

  - J) Yates.
  - K) Cherry Canyon Eddy County
  - L) Potash---(In the R-111-P Area (Page 3 & 4), a solid cement plug must be set across the salt section. Fluid used to mix the cement shall be saturated with the salts that are common to the section penetrated and in suitable proportions, not more than 3% calcium chloride (by weight of cement) will be considered the desired mixture whenever possible, WOC 4 hours and tag, this plug will be 50' below the bottom and 50' above the top of the Formation.
- 21. If cement does not exist behind casing strings at recommended formation depths, the casing can be cut and pulled with plugs set at recommended depths. If casing is not pulled, perforations will be shot and cement squeezed behind casing, WOC and tagged. These plugs will be set 50' below formation bottom to 50' above formation top inside the casing

#### **DRY HOLE MARKER REQUIRMENTS**

The operator shall mark the exact location of the plugged and abandoned well with a steel marker not less than four inches in diameter, 3' below ground level with a plate of at least ¼" welded to the top of the casing and the dry hole marker welded on the plate with the following information welded on the dry hole marker:

In these areas, a below ground marker is required with all pertinent information mentioned above on a plate, set 3' below ground level, a picture of the plate will be supplied to NMOCD for record, the exact location of the marker (longitude and latitude by GPS) will be provided to NMOCD (We typically require a current survey to verify the GPS)
