ORDER ON ORAL ARGUMENT ON POST-HEARING MOTIONS

THIS MATTER came before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission (“Commission”) pursuant to applications from Goodnight Midstream Permian (LLC (“Goodnight”) and Empire NM LLC’s (“Empire”) respectively, for Rehearing of the above captioned consolidated cases. It also came before the Commission on Goodnight’s Emergency Motion to Partially Stay Order R-24004 and upon Empire’s Emergency Motion to Enforce Order R-24004. In order to manage the docket in an orderly fashion, the Director of the Oil Conservation Division and Chair of the Commission (“Director”) hereby FINDS and ORDERS as follows:

1. The Commission will hold a hearing on October 16, 2025, on these pending post-hearing motions starting at 1:30 pm.
2. The Director finds that, in this case, the Commission may benefit from succinct oral arguments on these motions; but also needs to reserve sufficient time to deliberate on the motions.
3. Therefore, the Director hereby provides as follows:
 - a. Each party that participated in the underlying hearing will have the opportunity to make brief oral arguments on the pending motions.
 - b. Each party will be limited to 20 minutes for consolidated oral arguments on all pending motions. (i.e. 20 minutes to address all motions; NOT 20 minutes per motion.)
 - c. The Commission will hear arguments in the following order: (a) Empire, (b) Goodnight, (c) NM Oil Conservation Division, (d) Rice Operating Company/Permian Line, and (e) Pilot Water Solutions.
 - d. Parties will not be permitted to pool their time or allot their time to other entities.
