As a New Mexico resident, I strongly support strengthening financial assurance rules for oil and gas operators. These rules are essential to protect our communities and taxpayers from the growing burden of orphaned wells.

New Mexico has over 60,000 production wells, and nearly half are low-producing stripper wells. These wells often emit harmful gases and pose risks to our water and land—yet they generate too little revenue to cover cleanup costs. Too often, companies offload these wells to smaller operators who can't afford remediation, leaving taxpayers to foot the bill when bankruptcy hits.

The proposed rule is a good start, but it needs to go further:

- Trigger financial assurance earlier—waiting until 15% of wells are inactive is too late. Insolvency often sets in before that threshold.
- Base assurance amounts on actual costs—in 2024, plugging a well averaged \$163,000, not \$150,000.
- Include remediation, not just plugging—land and water cleanup can cost tens of thousands to millions and must be accounted for.

We deserve rules that prevent environmental harm and financial fallout before they happen. Please strengthen Case No. 24683 to reflect the true costs and risks.

The rule should encompass all of these interrelated concerns: The obligation to properly decommission a well must apply to all parties who have held an interest in that well, and they must be held jointly and severally liable.

All transactions that affect or shift the ownership of a pre-existing well must be approved by the New Mexico state government, which can deny the proposed transaction as inconsistent with the public interest. Any such transaction that would increase the risk of orphaning a well must be rejected.

All new drilling of wells or transactions that effect or shift the ownership of a pre-existing well must be accompanied by a well-specific bond, the amount of which must be determined by the State, and not be based on blanket bonds, flawed productivity projections, or financial gaming of future costs.

The obligation to plug and remediate a well must be permanent, and companies must not be released from their obligations following initial plugging of a well. Plugged wells must be monitored for damage or leaks and must be repaired at the operators' joint expense. The plugs do not last forever.

The obligation to plug and remediate inactive wells must be fully and promptly enforced.

Failure to do all this will be extremely harmful to New Mexicans and a heavy financial cost for directly impacted New Mexican and the state's tax payers.

I absolutely support a strong financial assurance rule(s) to hold New Mexico oil and gas operators accountable.

I also believe rules should do more to protect New Mexico taxpayers against bad operators. The rule should not allow low-producing well owners to sell to smaller companies that will not be able to pay for plugging or remediation so end up declaring bankruptcy and leaving us taxpayers to pay for it all.

The proposed financial assurance rules should be triggered when 5% of an operator's well are inactive.

The proposed rule should be based on on average plugging and remediation costs for a given well type in the prior fiscal year.

The proposed rule should require operators to provide financial assurance for plugging AND remediation of the land and water – as determined by an independent third-party evaluator, paid for by the operator.
