**APPLICATION OF EOG RESOURCES, INC.
TO AMEND ORDER R-24259,
LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.**

APPLICATION

EOG Resources, Inc. (“EOG”), OGRID Number 7377, through its undersigned attorneys, hereby files this application for the limited purpose of amending Order R-24259 (the “Order”) to remove the **Verminator 6 Fed Com #612H** well from the Order and to update the name and location of the **Verminator 6 Fed Com #581H** well. In support of this application, EOG states:

1. The Order was issued on March 20, 2026 in Case No. 25965.

1. The Order designated EOG as the operator and pooled all uncommitted interests in a 1108.48-acre, more or less, Bone Spring spacing unit comprised of Lots 6 and 7, and the E/2 SW/4 (SW/4 equivalent) of irregular Section 6, Lots 1 to 4 and the E/2 W/2 (W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 7, Lots 1 to 4 and the E/2 W/2 (W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 18, and Lots 1 to 4 and the E/2 W/2 (W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 19, Township 23 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

2. The Order dedicated the following wells to the spacing unit: **Verminator 6 Fed Com #581H** well with a proposed surface hole location in the NE/4 SE/4 (Unit K) of Section 6 and a proposed bottom hole location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit N) of Section 19; and **Verminator 6 Fed Com #612H and Verminator 6 Fed Com #611H** wells with proposed surface hole locations in the NE/4 SE/4 (Unit K) of Section 6 and proposed bottom hole locations in the Lot 4 (SW/4 SE/4 equivalent) of Section 19.

3. After the Order was issued, EOG determined not to drill the Verminator 6 Fed Com #612H in the Bone Spring formation.

4. EOG thus requests that the Order be amended to remove the Verminator 6 Fed Com #612H.

5. EOG has determined to change the name of the Verminator 6 Fed Com #581H to the Verminator 6 Fed Com #613H and to move that well to be within 330' from the adjoining tracts to maintain inclusion of the proximity tracts, which were previously included by virtue of the Verminator 6 Fed Com #612H well's location.

6. EOG is filing this application pursuant to the Division's November 1, 2025 "Notice: Procedure for Deviation from Orders," which, in relevant part, requires a hearing and amendment to an order for modifications beyond removing 20% of wells.

WHEREFORE, EOG requests this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on August 6, 2026 and after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order amending Order R-24259 as provided herein.

Applicant seeks an order from the Division amending Order R-24259 (the "Order") to remove the **Verminator 6 Fed Com #612H** well from the Order and to update the name and location of the **Verminator 6 Fed Com #581H** well. The Order pooled all uncommitted interests in a 1108.48-acre, more or less, Bone Spring spacing unit comprised of Lots 6 and 7, and the E/2 SW/4 (SW/4 equivalent) of irregular Section 6, Lots 1 to 4 and the E/2 W/2 (W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 7, Lots 1 to 4 and the E/2 W/2 (W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 18, and Lots 1 to 4 and the E/2 W/2 (W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 19, Township 23 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. The Order dedicated the following wells to the spacing unit: **Verminator 6 Fed Com #581H** well with a proposed surface hole location in the NE/4 SE/4 (Unit K) of Section 6 and a proposed bottom hole location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit N) of Section 19; and **Verminator 6 Fed Com #612H and Verminator 6 Fed Com #611H** wells with proposed surface hole locations in the NE/4 SE/4 (Unit K) of Section 6 and proposed bottom hole locations in the Lot 4 (SW/4 SE/4 equivalent) of Section 19. Said area is located approximately 15 miles southwest of Eunice, New Mexico.
