APPLICATION

Chevron U.S.A. Inc. ("Chevron") (OGRID No. 4323), through its undersigned attorneys, hereby files this application with the Oil Conservation Division pursuant to the provisions of NMSA 1978, § 70-2-17, for an order pooling all uncommitted interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying a 639.58-acre, more or less, standard horizontal spacing unit comprised of Lots 1 and 2 (the N/2NE/4 equivalent), S/2NE/4, and SE/4 of irregular Section 4 (collectively the E/2 equivalent of irregular Section 4), and the E/2 of Section 9, Township 24 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. In support of this application, Chevron states:

1. Chevron has an interest in the subject lands and has a right to drill and operate a well thereon.
2. Chevron seeks to dedicate Lots 1 and 2 (the N/2NE/4 equivalent), S/2NE/4, and SE/4 of irregular Section 4 (collectively the E/2 equivalent of irregular Section 4), and the E/2 of Section 9, Township 24 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico to form a standard 639.58-acre, more or less, Bone Spring horizontal spacing unit.
3. Chevron seeks to dedicate the spacing unit to the following wells:
 - **ZN 49 Fed Com 413H** well to be horizontally drilled with a proposed first take point in the NW/4NE/4 (Lot 2) of Section 4, to a proposed last take point in the SW/4 SE/4 (Unit O) of Section 9; and

- **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 414H** and **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 415H** wells to be horizontally drilled at a proposed first take point in the NE/4NE/4 (Lot 1) of Section 4, to a proposed last take point in the SE4/SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 9.

4. To the extent non-standard location approval is necessary, Chevron will apply administratively for such approval.

5. The completed interval for the **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 414H** well is expected to be less than 330 feet from the adjoining tracts thereby allowing for the inclusion of the proximity tracts within the proposed spacing unit under Rule 19.15.16.15(B)(1)(b) NMAC.

6. Chevron sought, but has been unable to obtain, a voluntary agreement from all interest owners in the Bone Spring formation underlying the proposed spacing unit to participate in the drilling of the wells or to otherwise commit their interests to the wells.

7. The pooling of all interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying the proposed unit will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

8. In order to permit Chevron to obtain its just and fair share of the oil and gas underlying the subject lands, all uncommitted interests in this horizontal spacing unit should be pooled and Chevron should be designated operator of the proposed wells and spacing unit.

WHEREFORE, Chevron requests this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on July 9, 2026 and after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order:

A. Pooling all uncommitted interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying a horizontal spacing unit comprised of Lots 1 and 2 (the N/2NE/4 equivalent), S/2NE/4, and SE/4 of irregular Section 4 (collectively the E/2 equivalent of irregular Section 4), and the E/2 of Section 9, Township 24 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico;

- B. Designating Chevron as operator of this unit and the wells to be drilled thereon;
- C. Authorizing Chevron to recover its costs of drilling, equipping and completing the wells;
- D. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedure; and
- E. Setting a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling and completing the wells in the event a working interest owner elects not to participate in the wells.

Applicant seeks an order from the Division pooling all uncommitted mineral interests within a 639.58-acre, more or less, Bone Spring horizontal spacing unit comprised of Lots 1 and 2 (the N/2NE/4 equivalent), S/2NE/4, and SE/4 of irregular Section 4 (collectively the E/2 equivalent of irregular Section 4), and the E/2 of Section 9, Township 24 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. This spacing unit will be dedicated to the following wells: **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 413H** well to be horizontally drilled with a proposed first take point in the NW/4NE/4 (Lot 2) of Section 4, to a proposed last take point in the SW/4 SE/4 (Unit O) of Section 9; and **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 414H** and **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 415H** wells to be horizontally drilled at a proposed first take point in the NE/4NE/4 (Lot 1) of Section 4, to a proposed last take point in the SE4/SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 9. To the extent non-standard location approval is necessary, Chevron will apply administratively for such approval. The completed interval for the **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 414H** well is expected to be less than 330 feet from the adjoining tracts thereby allowing for the inclusion of the proximity tracts within the proposed spacing unit under Rule 19.15.16.15(B)(1)(b) NMAC. Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing said wells, the allocation of these costs as well as the actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of Chevron U.S.A. Inc. as operator of the wells, and a 200% charge for risk involved in drilling said wells. The unit is located approximately 18.5 miles northwest of Jal, New Mexico.

SELF-AFFIRMED DECLARATION OF NICHOLAS ANGELLE

Nicholas Angelle hereby states and declares as follows:

1. I am over the age of 18, I am a land professional for Chevron U.S.A. Inc., and I have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein.
2. I have previously testified before the Oil Conservation Division (“Division”) and my credentials as an expert petroleum landman were accepted as a matter of record.
3. My area of responsibility at Chevron includes the area of Lea County in New Mexico.
4. I am familiar with the application Chevron filed in this case, which is included in the exhibit packet as **Exhibit A.1**.
5. I am familiar with the status of the lands that are subject to the application.
6. I submit the following information pursuant to NMAC 19.15.4.12.A(1) in support of the above referenced compulsory pooling application.
7. The purpose of the application is to force pool all uncommitted interests into the horizontal spacing unit described below, and in the wells to be drilled in the unit.
8. No opposition is expected because the interest owners being pooled have been contacted regarding the proposed well, but have failed or refused to voluntarily commit their interests in the wells.

9. In this case, Chevron seeks an order from the Division pooling all uncommitted interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying a 639.58-acre, more or less, standard horizontal spacing unit comprised of Lots 1 and 2 (the N/2NE/4 equivalent), S/2NE/4, and SE/4 of irregular Section 4 (collectively the E/2 equivalent of irregular Section 4), and the E/2 of Section 9, Township 24 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

10. The spacing unit will be dedicated to the following wells:

- **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 413H** well to be horizontally drilled with a proposed first take point in the NW/4NE/4 (Lot 2) of Section 4, to a proposed last take point in the SW/4 SE/4 (Unit O) of Section 9; and
- **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 414H** and **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 415H** wells to be horizontally drilled at a proposed first take point in the NE/4NE/4 (Lot 1) of Section 4, to a proposed last take point in the SE4/SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 9.

11. To the extent non-standard location approval is necessary, Chevron will apply administratively for such approval.

12. The completed interval for the **ZN 4 9 Fed Com 414H** well is expected to be less than 330 feet from the adjoining tracts thereby allowing for the inclusion of the proximity tracts within the proposed spacing unit under Rule 19.15.16.15(B)(1)(b) NMAC.

13. Attached as **Exhibit A.3** are the proposed C-102s for the wells.

14. **Exhibit A.4** is a plat of tracts, including tract ownership and applicable lease numbers.

15. **Exhibit A.5** includes a unit recapitulation of the interest owners and percentage ownership. Exhibit A.5 also identifies the parties to be pooled by yellow highlighting.

16. I have conducted a diligent search of the public records in the county where the well is located, and conducted phone directory and computer searches to locate contact information for parties entitled to notification, and mailed the working interest owners well proposals, including the Authorizations for Expenditure (AFEs).

17. In my opinion, Chevron has made a good faith effort to obtain voluntary joinder of the uncommitted mineral interest owners in the proposed wells.

18. **Exhibit A.6** contains a sample well proposal letter and AFEs. The estimated cost of the wells set forth in the AFEs are fair and reasonable and comparable to the costs of other wells of similar depths and length drilled in this area of New Mexico.

19. Chevron requests overhead and administrative rates of \$13,030 month for drilling the well and \$1,170 month for the producing well. These rates are fair, and comparable to the rates charged by other operators for wells of this type in this area of Southeastern, New Mexico. Chevron requests that these rates be adjusted periodically as provided in the COPAS Accounting Procedure.

20. Chevron requests the maximum cost plus 200% risk charge be assessed against non-consenting working interest owners.

21. In my opinion, Chevron has made a good faith effort to obtain voluntary joinder of the working interest owners in the proposed wells as demonstrated by the chronology of contact in **Exhibit A.7**.

22. The parties Chevron is seeking to pool were notified of this hearing. Chevron seeks to pool overriding royalty interest owners, and they were also provided notice of this hearing.

23. **Exhibit A.8** is a table identifying all owners within the proposed unit, and include the owner's name, ownership status, commitment type, and notice provided specifying the method

and date of notice along with a reference to the supporting exhibit. The information regarding the method and date of notice was provided by counsel for Chevron.

24. In my opinion, the granting of this application is in the interests of conservation and the prevention of waste.

25. The attachments to this self-affirmed declaration were prepared by me, or compiled from company business records, or were prepared at my direction.

26. Pursuant to Rule 1-011 NMRA, I declare and affirm under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of New Mexico that the foregoing statements are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.

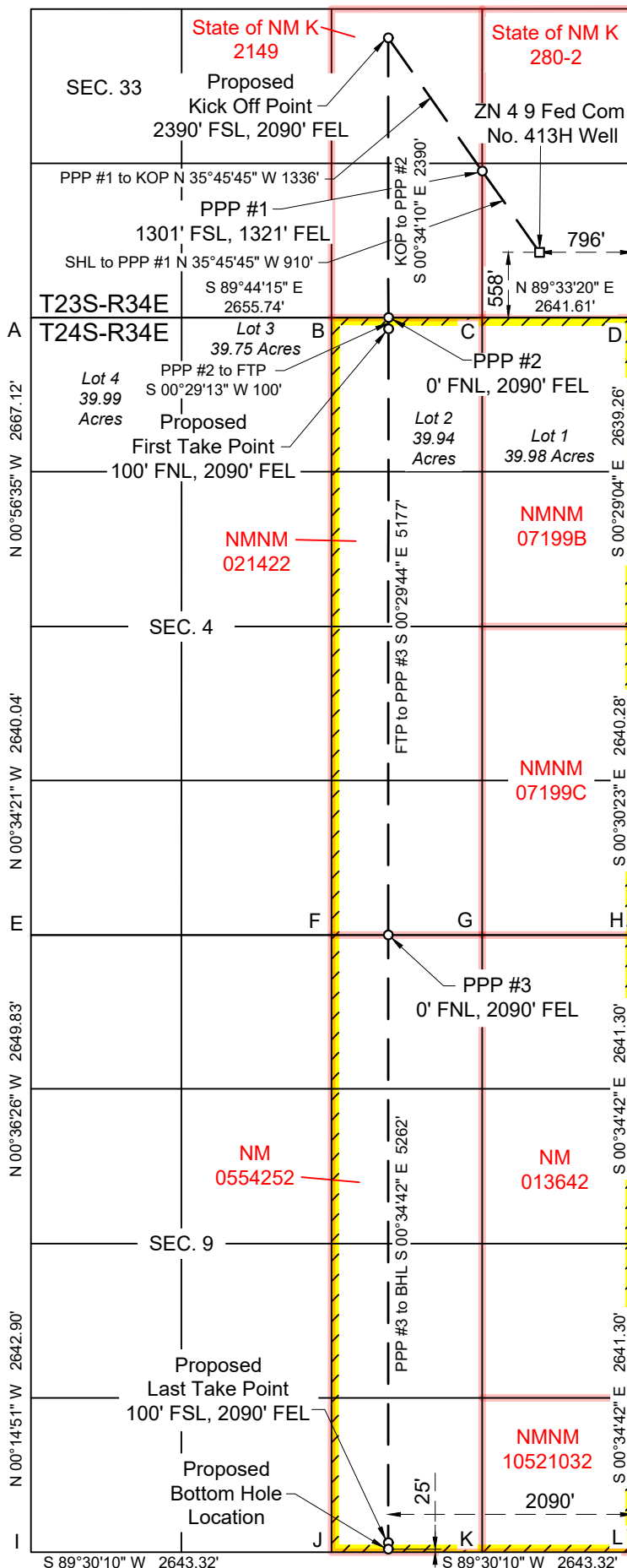

If any Working Interest Parties elect not to participate in the drilling of subject wells or do not respond, Chevron will submit an application for a Compulsory Pooling Order with the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division after 30 days of receipt of this letter. This will allow Chevron to move forward with planning and drilling the subject wells while allowing time to properly execute a JOA amongst the parties.

SELF-AFFIRMED DECLARATION OF COLIN MACRITCHIE

Colin MacRitchie hereby states and declares as follows:

1. I am over the age of 18, I am a lead geologist for Chevron U.S.A. Inc. ("Chevron"), and have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein.

2. I have not previously testified before the Oil Conservation Division ("Division"). My resume is attached as **Exhibit B.4**. I received my M.Sc. from UT Permian Basin in 2018. I received my B.Sc. from Ohio University in 2017. I have been a petroleum geologist at Chevron since 2018. Prior to being a petroleum geologist, I worked for Chevron as an asset development technologist from 2014 to 2018. Prior to working at Chevron, I worked at Weatherford as a logging specialist in the Permian Basin from 2013 to 2018.

3. My area of responsibility at Chevron includes the area of Lea County in New Mexico.

4. I am familiar with the application Chevron filed in this case.

5. **Exhibit B.1** is a locator map showing the approximate location of the proposed unit. The proposed spacing unit is identified by a highlighted gray box. The proposed wells are identified by multicolored lines within the gray box. Also shown is a diagram of Chevron's development plan.

6. **Exhibit B.2** is structure map of the Second Bone Spring formation. The proposed spacing unit is identified by a black dashed box. The contour interval used in this exhibit is 100

feet. **Exhibit B.2** also shows a gross isopach map where the spacing unit is identified by a black dashed box.

7. **Exhibit B.3** identifies six wells in the vicinity of the proposed wells, shown by a line of cross-section running from A to A'. The stratigraphic cross section is hung on the top of the Second Bone Spring formation. The well logs on the cross-section give a representative sample of the Second Bone Spring formation in the area. The target zone is identified by the word "SBU_TGT1" and a green dashed line across the cross section.

8. I conclude from the maps that:

- a. The horizontal spacing unit is justified from a geologic standpoint.
- b. There are no structural impediments or faulting that will interfere with horizontal development.
- c. Each quarter quarter section in the proposed unit will contribute more or less equally to production.

9. The preferred well orientation in this area is North-South. This is because the S_{Hmax} is at approximately 075° .

10. In my opinion, the granting of Chevron's application is in the interests of conservation and the prevention of waste.

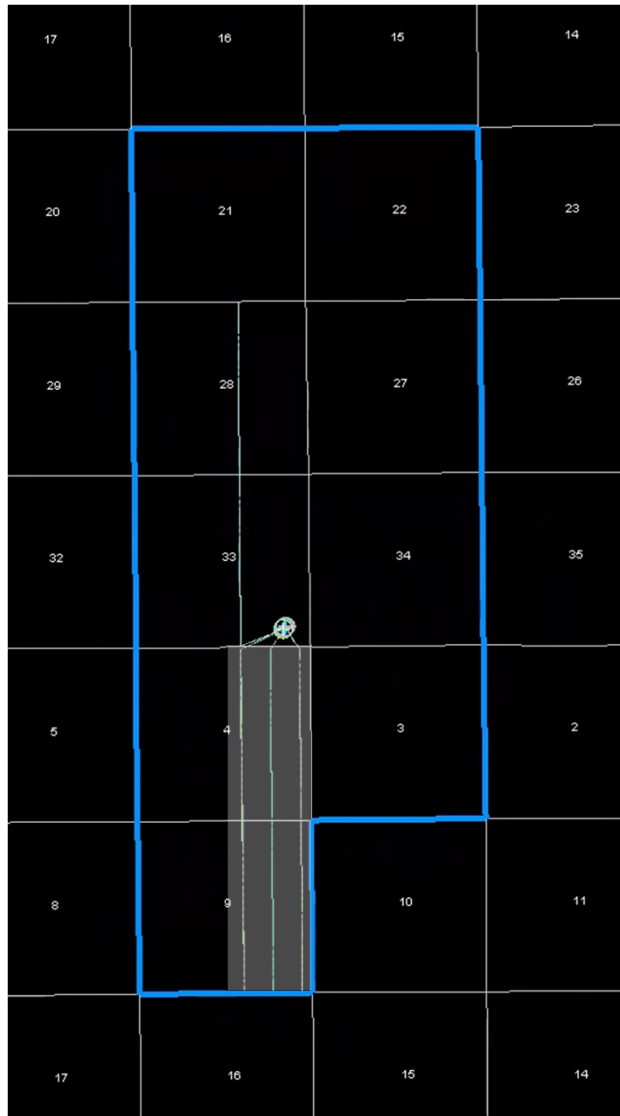

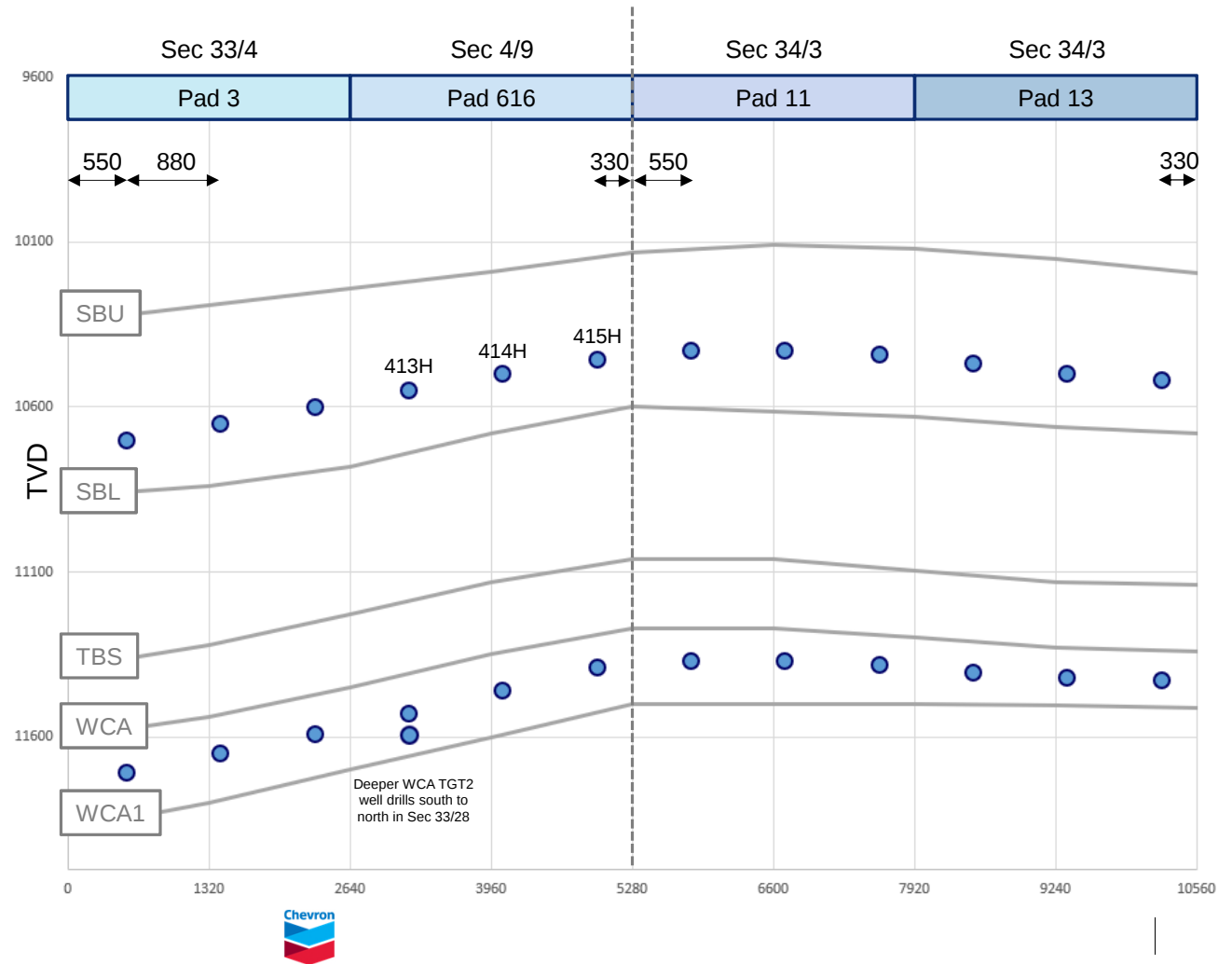

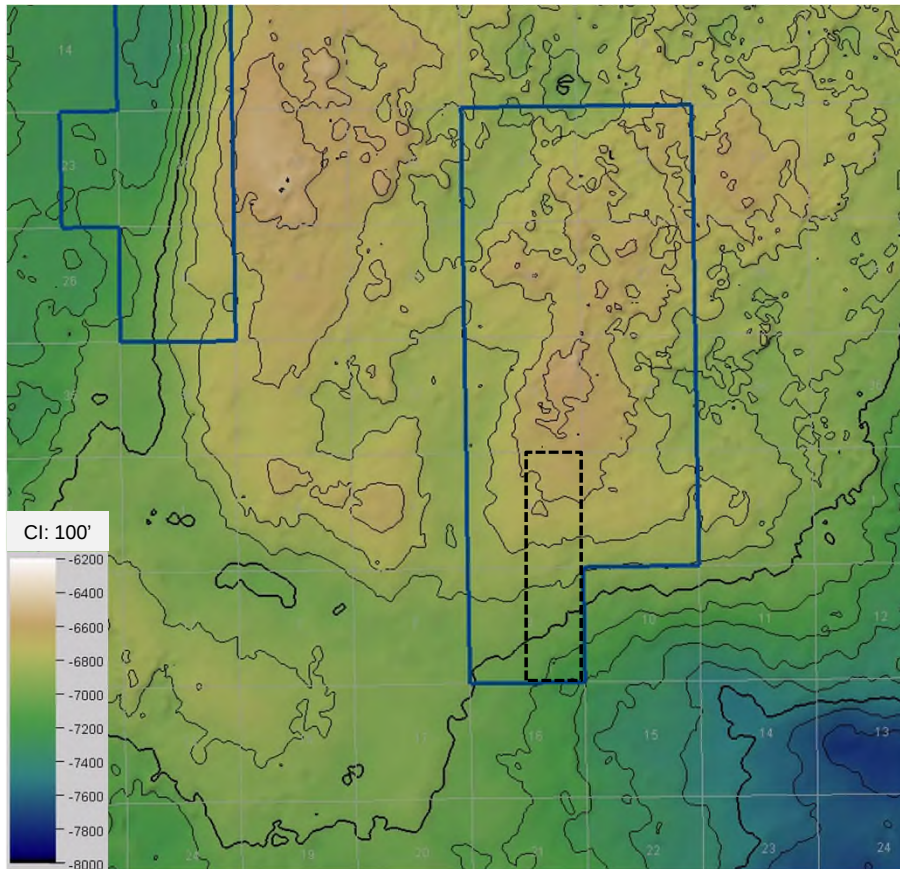


Pad 616 ZN 4 9 Unit Outline

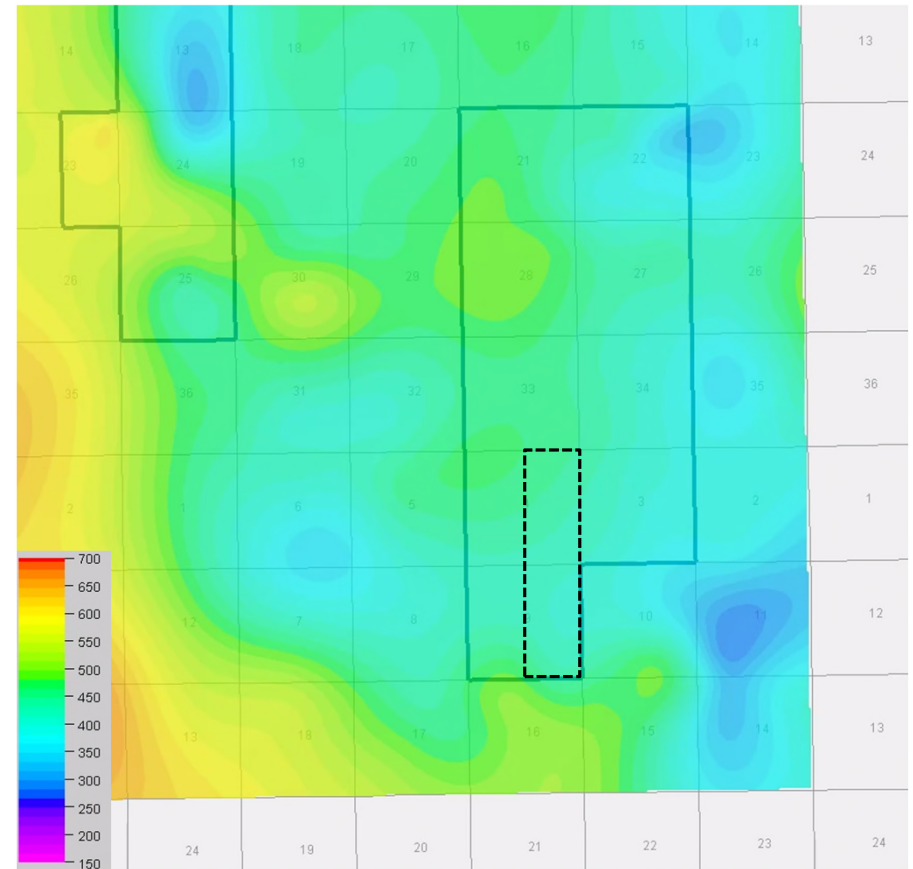
SBU Structure and Isopach Map

SBU Structure (TVDSS ft)



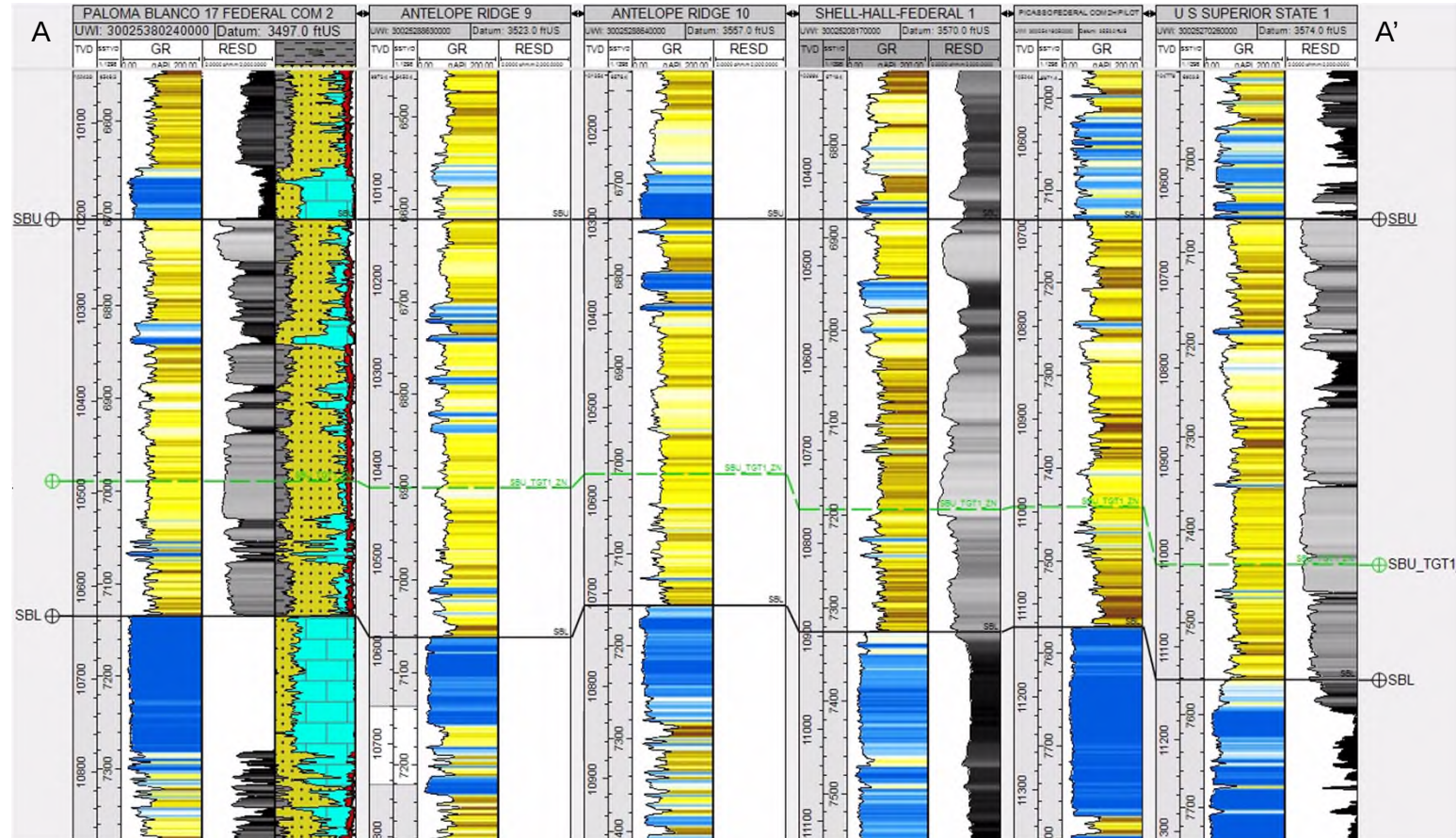
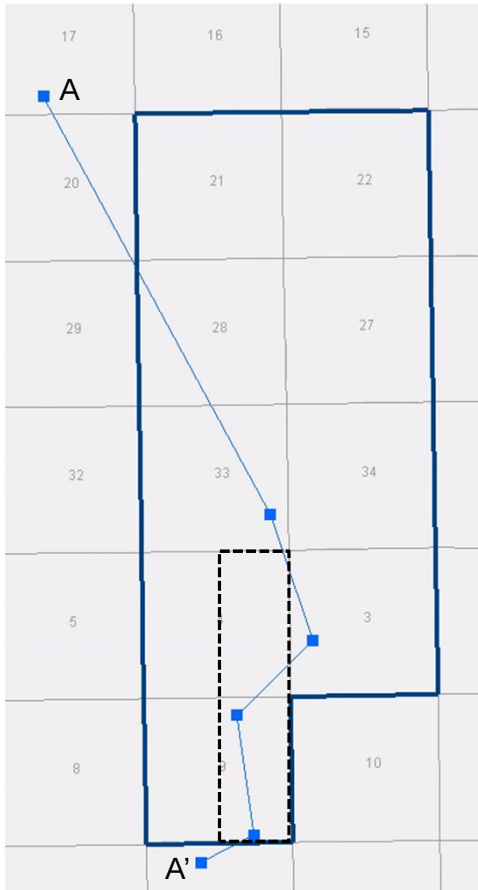
SBU – SBL Isopach (ft)

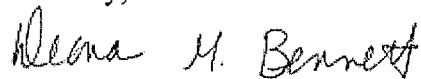

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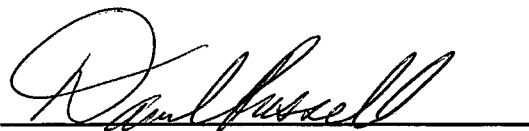

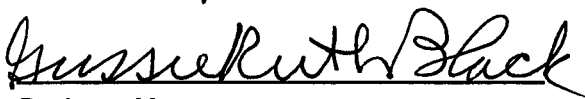
