ORDER AMENDING PRE-HEARING ORDER

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On June 9, 2026, NSP Resources, LLC filed the underlying Application in Case No. 26287.
2. Counsel for various objecting parties entered appearances throughout June and July 2026.
3. The Division conducted status conferences on July 23, 2026 and August 20, 2026, during which counsel advised the Division of potential conflicting representations and competing applications.
4. At the August 20 status conference, the Hearing Examiner offered available hearing dates of October 20, 2026 or November 3, 2026, requesting that counsel notify the Division of preferred dates by the end of the day.
5. On August 21, 2026, the Division issued its Pre-Hearing Order setting the contested hearing for October 20, 2026.
6. On August 24, 2026, new counsel substituted in for Permian Resources Operating LLC, limiting their ability to provide input on the original hearing date.
7. Permian Resources subsequently filed competing applications on August 28, 2026, in Case Nos. 26485 and 26486, and indicated an intent to move for consolidation.
8. Counsel for Permian Resources has multiple previously scheduled contested hearings on October 20 and October 27, 2026, resulting in scheduling conflicts and the need for adequate preparation time.
9. Continuing the hearing to November 3, 2026 allows counsel to prepare and avoids prejudice to any party. NSP Resources consented to the continuance, and all contacted parties concurred.

10. On September 4, 2026, Permian Resources filed an Unopposed Motion for Continuance requesting that the matter be continued to the November 3, 2026 contested docket.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Oil Conservation Division has jurisdiction over the parties and subject matter pursuant to the Oil and Gas Act, NMSA 1978, Section 70-2-1 et seq.
2. Under the Division's procedural authority, the Hearing Examiner may continue hearings and amend pre-hearing orders upon a showing of good cause.
3. The Unopposed Motion and supporting factual statements demonstrate good cause to continue the contested hearing.
4. No party will be prejudiced by the requested continuance, and the amendment ensures orderly presentation of evidence and meaningful participation by counsel.
5. The Pre-Hearing Order issued on August 21, 2026 should therefore be amended solely to update the contested hearing date.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. Permian Resources Operating, LLC's Unopposed Motion for Continuance is GRANTED.
2. The contested hearing previously set for October 20, 2026, is hereby continued to November 3, 2026.
3. The Pre-Hearing Order dated August 21, 2026, remains otherwise in full force and effect and is amended only to reflect the new contested hearing date.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
