**APPLICATION**

Mewbourne Oil Company ("Mewbourne" or "Applicant") (OGRID No. 14744), through its undersigned attorneys, hereby files this application with the Oil Conservation Division pursuant to the provisions of NMSA 1978, § 70-2-17, for an order pooling all uncommitted interest owners in a standard 480.19-acre, more or less, horizontal well spacing unit in the Bone Spring formation underlying the W/2 W/2 of Sections 29 and 32, Township 19 South, Range 36 East, and Lot 4, SW/4 NW/4, and W/2 SW/4 (W/2 W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 5, Township 20 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. In support of its application, Mewbourne states:

1. Applicant is a working interest owner in the proposed horizontal spacing unit and has the right to drill thereon.
2. Mewbourne seeks to dedicate the above-referenced spacing unit to the proposed **Saddle Bronc 5/29 Federal Com 522H** well, to be drilled from a surface location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of irregular Section 6, T20S-R36E, a first take point in the SW/4 SW/4 (Unit M) of irregular Section 5, T20S-R36E, and a last take point in the NW/4 NW/4 (Unit D) of Section 29, T19S-R36E.
3. Applicant has sought and been unable to obtain voluntary agreement for the development of these lands from all interest owners in the subject spacing unit.

4. The pooling of interests will avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, will prevent waste, and will protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that this matter be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on October 8, 2026, and, after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter an order:

- A. Pooling all uncommitted interest owners in the horizontal spacing unit;
- B. Designating Applicant as operator of this spacing unit and the horizontal well to be drilled thereon;
- C. Authorizing Applicant to recover its costs of drilling, completing, and equipping the well;
- D. Approving the actual operating charges and costs of supervision while drilling and after completion, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedures; and
- E. Imposing a 200% charge for the risk assumed by Applicant in drilling and completing the well against any working interest owner who does not voluntarily participate in the drilling of the well.

**Application of Mewbourne Oil Company for Compulsory Pooling, Lea County, New Mexico.** Applicant in the above-styled cause seeks an order pooling all uncommitted interest owners in a standard 480.19-acre, more or less, horizontal well spacing unit in the Bone Spring formation underlying the W/2 W/2 of Sections 29 and 32, Township 19 South, Range 36 East, and Lot 4, SW/4 NW/4, and W/2 SW/4 (W/2 W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 5, Township 20 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. This spacing unit will be initially dedicated to the proposed **Saddle Bronc 5/29 Federal Com 522H** well, to be drilled from a surface location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of irregular Section 6, T20S-R36E, a first take point in the SW/4 SW/4 (Unit M) of irregular Section 5, T20S-R36E, and a last take point in the NW/4 NW/4 (Unit D) of Section 29, T19S-R36E. Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing the well and the allocation of the costs thereof, the operating costs and charges for supervision, the designation of applicant as operator of the proposed spacing unit, and a 200% charge for risk involved in drilling said well. Said area is located approximately 15 miles southwest of Hobbs, New Mexico.
