scott.rodgers	The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (OCD) acts as a repository for documents pertaining to produced fluid spills and releases that may occur on Native American Tribal Lands, as a result of the production of oil and gas, on Tribal Lands. The OCD performs this function at the sole discretion of the relevant Tribal Authority. The oil and gas producer may file Form C-141 with OCD which will create an incident number and a document file in OCD's Permitting System. Once created, this incident number will remain in "closed" status but will be available to document the spill or release, any remedial activities associated with the spill or release, or other documentation as the relevant Tribal Authority may deem appropriate. Under these terms, this incident number is closed, but may be an ongoing remedial project.	9/27/2024
