Dear Mr. Bruce:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your initial application that was submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") on September 23, 2004 (**administrative application reference No. pSEM0-426749412**) on behalf of the operator, J. Cleo Thompson and James Cleo Thompson, Jr., L. P. ("Thompson"); (ii) your telefax duplicate of this application of September 29, 2004 to Mr. David R. Catanach, Engineer/Hearing Officer with the Division in Santa Fe; (iii) your meeting with Mr. Michael E. Stogner, Division Engineer/Chief Hearing Officer in Santa Fe; and (iv) the Division's records in Santa Fe: all concerning J. Cleo Thompson's request for an exception to the well location requirements (**Rule 4**) provided within the "*Special Rules and Regulations for the North Knowles-Devonian Pool*," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8497, as amended, for Thompson's proposed Lawrence Well No. 1 (**API No. 30-025-36898**) to be drilled 2531 feet from the North line and 630 feet from the East line (Unit H) of Section 14, Township 16 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Undesignated North Knowles-Devonian Pool (36330), Lea County, New Mexico. The E/2 NE/4 of Section 14 is to be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 80-acre stand-up oil spacing and proration unit for this pool (as provided for by **Rule 2** of the special pool rules).

This application has been duly filed under the provisions of: (i) **Rule 5** of the special pool rules governing the North Knowles-Devonian Pool; (ii) Division Rule 104.F, revised by Division Order No. R-11231, issued by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission ("Commission") in Case No. 12119 on August 12, 1999; and (iii) Rule 1207.A (2), revised by Division Order No. R-11205, issued by the Commission in Case No. 12177 on June 17, 1999.

The geologic interpretation submitted with this application indicates that a well drilled at the proposed unorthodox oil well location will be at a more favorable geologic position within the Devonian formation underlying this unit, thereby increasing the likelihood of obtaining commercial production.


