With the exception of the August 2007 result for MW-11 (GRO at 1.4 mg/L), no contaminants of concern have ever been detected above laboratory detection limits in the period between when the monitor wells were installed (July 2007) and January 2010 (eight consecutive quarters of sampling).

Following the receipt of a closure letter, AES will schedule the plugging and abandonment of monitor wells MW-1 through MW-11. A letter report will be prepared and submitted to the Oil Conservation Division (Santa Fe, New Mexico) and the Jicarilla Apache Nation Environmental Protection Office (Dulce, New Mexico) following completion of well plugging and abandonment.
