Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* The SWD tanks overflowed due to a pump malfunction and high level alarm failure. The water coming into the facility was diverted and the power was restored to the facility the next day

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* The SWD tanks are inside a poly lined metal containment which contained most of the released fluid, the wind was blowing extremely hard to the north west carrying the fluid outside of the containment and misting an area of approximately 23,400 sq. ft of pasture land with a fine mist of oil and water. The soil had less than 1/4" of saturation. The area around the pumps and concrete pad area were affected by the release with a saturation of approximately 1 ft. in depth. The remediation will comply with the NMOCD and BLM requirements for spills.
