Reference is made to your application received on November 18, 2014.

You have requested to drill this well at an unorthodox carbon dioxide well location described above in the referenced pool or formation. This proration unit is governed by statewide Rule 19.15.15.10.C NMAC, which provides for 160-acre units, with wells located at least 660 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is unorthodox because a portion of the project area is less than 660 feet from the unit boundary.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 19.15.15.13 NMAC and 19.15.4.12.A (2) NMAC.

It is our understanding that you are seeking this location to avoid drilling hazards and improve the chances of hitting an advantageous reservoir position.

It is also understood that notice of this application to offsetting operators or owners is unnecessary due to common ownership.


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Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 19.15.15.13 (B) NMAC, the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.
