**Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.\***

On June 3, 2011 at approximately 1600 a field operator discovered that a DCP 8-inch pipeline had leaked crude oil. The leak was reported both internally and externally and the line removed from service. The leak is attributed to corrosion.

**Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.\***

A vacuum truck was dispatched and recovered approximately 11 bbls of oil. OCD was notified by telephone and e-mail on June 6, 2011 and BLM was notified by telephone on June 6, 2011. BLM's Paul Evans visited the site and requested that an archeological survey be performed as the spill had progressed from the lease road approximately 150 yards southeast of the break, bordering a suspected arc site. Boone Archeology of Carlsbad, NM conducted a survey and field monitored cleanup activities of DCP's 3<sup>rd</sup> party contractor NOVA (See NOVA report dated October 2011). Approx 80 feet of the pipeline was replaced. The cleanup is considered closed.
