In addition, this approval does not relieve Holly Corporation of responsibility for compliance with any other federal, state, local laws and/or regulations.

In our conversation on August 24, 2009, in regards to the Holly Energy Deppco Leak you gave permission to start work on location on excavating the west wall. It was also stated that you would like the bottom of the excavation to be delineated further utilizing a track hoe to determine the extent of the contamination. If the extent of contamination is not reached just as long as the TPH show a decline will be okay. Anything under 5,000 PPM will be okay to place into the excavation. The remaining contamination will be hauled to an approved NMOCD facility.
