Dear Mr. Hawkins:

Reference is made to your application dated December 12, 1994 for an unorthodox Blanco-Mesaverde gas well location on an existing non-standard gas spacing and proration unit (GPU) for said Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, which comprises an area of only 284.80 acres, consisting of Lots 3 and 4 and the E/2 SW/4 (SW/4 equivalent) of irregular Section 30 and Lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, 17, and 18 (W/2 equivalent) of irregular Section 31, both in Township 30 North, Range 8 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico. Said GPU, which should only be carrying an acreage factor of 0.89, was authorized by Division Order No. R-392, dated November 24, 1953, and had dedicated thereon the Dawson "LS" Well No. 1 (API No. 30-045-10273) located 1750 feet from the South line and 1175 feet from the West line (Unit K) of said Section 30.

By Division Administrative Order NSL-947, dated May 29, 1978, the Dawson "LS" Well No. 1A (API No. 30-045-23092) was authorized to be drilled at an unorthodox infill gas well location in the subject GPU, 640 feet from the North line and 985 feet from the West line (Lot 7/Unit C) of said Section 31.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox gas well location in said Section 31 is hereby approved:

**Dawson "LS" Well No. 1B
1270' FSL - 620' FWL (Lot 10/Unit N)**

Further, Amoco is hereby authorized to simultaneously dedicate Blanco-Mesaverde gas production on the subject GPU from the Dawson "LS" Well No. 1B with the two existing Dawson "LS" Well Nos. 1 and 1A. Said wells and GPU will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest New Mexico.
