





Dear Sir:

The Bureau of Land Management has designated the Angel Peak Recreation Area and is committed to managing the area for its scenic and recreation values. This does not exclude development of oil and gas but occasionally a situation arises in which we feel that a proposed well site can be located in a manner so as to minimize the aesthetic impacts to the recreation area. This is the case with Amoco's proposed Jack Frost Com "C" 1E. The original proposed location was situated next to the Angel Peak Campground and was directly adjacent to the campground loop road and close to a couple of developed campsites. The site was in an area with quite a bit of vegetation and relief and since the proposed well was to the Dakota formation, a significant amount of surface disturbance could be expected.



After a field inspection of the site, Bill Gregg, Recreation Planner and Jack Spears, Environmental Inspection determined that the original location was undesirable and found an alternate site that would be much more suitable. The new location is beyond a small ridge and can't even be seen from the campground. It is also in an area of less relief and would consequently require less dirt work. The BLM is therefore proposing that Amoco move to the new location (1520 FNL, 450 FEL, Section 26, T. 27 N., R. 10 W.) and would greatly appreciate your cooperation in this matter.
