Dear Ms. Bradfield:

Reference is made to your application dated May 5, 1993 for an unorthodox Blanco-Mesaverde gas well location on a previously approved (Division Administrative Order NWU-284, dated August 6, 1958) non-standard 266.77-acre gas spacing and proration unit (GPU) for said Blanco-Mesaverde Pool comprising Lots 5 through 12 (N/2 equivalent) of Section 7, Township 31 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico. Said GPU presently has dedicated thereon the Johnston Federal Well Nos. 7 and 7A located in Units A and F, respectively, of said Section 7.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox gas well location is hereby approved:

**Johnston Federal Well No. 7-B
1275' FNL - 810' FWL (Unit C)**

Further, Meridian is authorized to simultaneously dedicate Blanco-Mesaverde gas production on the subject GPU from the No. 7-B well with the two existing Well Nos. 7 and 7-A. Said wells and GPU will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest New Mexico.
