Dear Ms. Edwards:

Reference is made to the following:

(a) your application (**administrative application reference No. pKVR08-05636603**) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (the Division) in Santa Fe, New Mexico on February 22, 2008, and

(b) the Division's records pertinent to this request.

COG Operating LLC (COG) has requested to drill the above-referenced well at an unorthodox oil well location, 2437 feet from the South line and 860 feet from the East line (Unit I) of Section 19, Township 17 South, Range 32 East, N.M.P.M., in Lea County, New Mexico. The NE/4 SE/4 of Section 19 will be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 40-acre spacing unit in the West Maljamar Yeso Pool (44500). This pool is governed by statewide Rule 104.B(1), which provides for 40-acre units, with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is less than 330 feet from the northern unit boundary.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 104.F and 1210.A(2).

It is our understanding that you are seeking this location to avoid interference with existing underground pipelines that cross this unit.




It is also understood that notice of this application to offsetting operators or owners is unnecessary because COG owns 100% of the working interest in the offsetting unit towards which this location encroaches.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 104.F(2), the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

This approval is subject to your being in compliance with all other applicable Division rules, including, but not limited to Division Rule 40.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
