*Amended Administrative Order NSL-3380*

Dear Mr. Benson:

Reference is made to your application dated August 10, 1994 to amend Division Administrative Order NSL-3380, dated April 26, 1994, which authorized UNOCAL to drill its Rincon Unit Well No. 302 (API No. 30-039-25396) at an unorthodox gas well location for both the Basin-Dakota and Undesignated Largo-Gallup Pools 150 feet from the North line and 2455 feet from the West line (Unit C) of Section 11, Township 26 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. The W/2 of said Section 11 to be dedicated to said well to form a standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit for both pools.

It is our understanding that the Gallup interval does not appear to be commercially productive at this time and that UNOCAL is requesting that the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool be included in the provisions of said Order NSL-3380.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(c) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the aforementioned unorthodox gas well location is also approved for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool. Further, said well shall be included in the existing 320-acre standard gas spacing and proration unit in the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, which is currently dedicated to its Rincon Unit Well No. 102 (API No. 30-039-06545), located at a standard gas well location 990 feet from the South and West lines (Unit M) of said Section 11.

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All other provisions of the original order NSL-3380 shall remain in full force and effect until further notice.
