Dear Mr. Hawkins:

Reference is made to your application dated November 21, 1994 for a non-standard Basin-Fruitland coal gas well location for your existing Stanolind Gas Com "E" Well No. 1 (API No. 30-045-24149), located 1390 feet from the South line and 890 feet from the East line (Lot 6/Unit I) of irregular Section 9, Township 32 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, which was drilled in 1980 to a total depth of 7,109 feet. Since that time this well has produced from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, the McDermott-Gallup Pool, and the Greenhorn formation.

It is our understanding that the Greenhorn and Gallup intervals have been properly plugged off and that Amoco intends to dually complete the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool in said well. The existing 280.38-acre non-standard gas spacing and proration in the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool comprising all of said Section 9 is currently dedicated to said well. It is further our understanding that this same acreage is to be dedicated to the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool.
