Dear Ms. Bradfield:

Reference is made to your application dated April 7, 1997 for an unorthodox Blanco-Mesaverde "infill" gas well location on an existing standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit ("GPU") for said Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, comprising the W/2 of Section 34, Township 30 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. Said GPU is currently dedicated to the San Juan "30-6" Unit Well No. 61 (API No. 30-039-07714) located at a standard gas well location 890 feet from the South line and 1650 feet from the West line (Unit N) of said Section 34.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the "*General Rules For The Prorated Gas Pools of New Mexico/Special Rules and Regulations For The Blanco-Mesaverde Pool*", as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox "infill" gas well location in the W/2 of said Section 34 is hereby approved:

San Juan "30-6" Unit Well No. 61-A
1410' FNL - 910' FWL (Unit E)

Further, both the San Juan "30-6" Unit Well Nos. 61 and 61-A are to be dedicated to the subject GPU, further said wells and GPU will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest New Mexico.
