
Dear Ms. Bradfield:

Reference is made to your application dated July 24, 1997 for an unorthodox "infill" gas well location for both the Blanco-Mesaverde and Basin-Dakota Pools for the proposed San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 151-M to be drilled 2065 feet from the South line and 2005 feet from the East line (Unit J) of Section 34, Township 28 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

Production from the Basin-Dakota Pool is to be included in an existing standard 324.63-acre gas spacing and proration unit comprising Lots 1 and 2, the NE/4, and the N/2 SE/4 (E/2 equivalent) of said Section 34 which is currently dedicated to your San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 151 (API No. 30-039-20317), located at a standard gas well location 1650 feet from the North and East lines (Unit G) of said Section 34 and production from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool is to be included in an existing standard 324.63-acre gas spacing and proration unit that also comprises the E/2 equivalent of said Section 34 and is currently dedicated to Burlington's San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 41 (API No. 30-039-07268), located at a standard gas well location 990 feet from the North and East lines (Unit A) of said Section 34.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the "*General Rules for the Prorated Gas Pools of New Mexico/Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool/Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool*", as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the above-described unorthodox "infill" gas well location for the San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 151-M is hereby approved.
