
Reference is made to your application dated August 22, 1997 for an unorthodox Blanco-Mesaverde "infill" gas well location on an existing standard 320-acre, more or less, gas spacing and proration unit ("GPU") for said Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, comprising the W/2 equivalent of Section 10, Township 30 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. Said GPU is currently dedicated to the San Juan "30-6" Unit Well No. 34 (API No. 30-039-07866), located at a standard gas well location 800 feet from the South and West lines (Unit M) of said Section 10.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of **Rule 2(d)** of the "*General Rules for the Prorated Gas Pools of New Mexico/Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool*", as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox "infill" gas well location in said Section 10 is hereby approved:

**San Juan "30-6" Unit Well No. 34-A**  
**490' FNL - 2340' FWL (Unit C)**

Further, both the San Juan "30-6" Unit Well Nos. 34 and 34-A are to be dedicated to the subject GPU, further said wells and GPU will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest New Mexico.
