Reference is made to your application dated February 10, 1999 for an exception to the well location requirements provided within the "Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-10987, for a non-standard Basin-Dakota infill gas well location in an existing standard 320-acre stand-up gas spacing and proration unit for the Basin-Dakota Pool comprising the E/2 of Section 27, Township 28 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. This unit is currently dedicated to Conoco, Inc.'s San Juan "28-7" Unit Well No. 190 (API No. 30-039-20590), located at a standard gas well location 1840 feet from the North line and 800 feet from the East line (Unit H) of Section 27.

The application has been duly filed under the provisions of New Mexico Oil Conservation Division Rules 104.F and 605.B.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F(2), the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox infill gas well location in Section 27 is hereby approved:

San Juan "28-7" Unit Well No. 190-M 2305' FSL & 2335' FEL (Unit J).

Further, both of the aforementioned San Juan "28-7" Unit Well Nos. 190 and 190-M and existing gas spacing and proration unit will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest, New Mexico.
