Dear Mr. Cox:

Reference is made to your request dated August 16, 1999 to increase the surface injection pressure on the above referenced well. This request is based on data obtained from a step rate test conducted on August 5, 1999. The results of the test have been reviewed by my staff and we feel an increase in injection pressure on this well is justified at this time.

You are therefore authorized to increase the surface injection pressure on the following well:

Table with 2 columns: Well and Location, Maximum Injection Pressure. Row 1: N.M.F. State Well No. 1, 1600 PSIG. Row 2: Located in Section 36, Township 20 South, Range 38 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

The Division Director may rescind this injection pressure increase if it becomes apparent that the injected water is not being confined to the injection zone or is endangering any fresh water aquifers.
