Mr. Jones:

I am writing to you to request an extension to this permit that was granted to EverQuest Energy on April 10, 2009. We would like a 12-month extension that would extend the permit until April 10, 2011.

We postponed the well work to re-enter the wellbore and convert it to SWD service pending the outcome of the protested application of the Gandy-Albacore 25 #1 SWD permit. You are familiar with that case as you were the technical hearing examiner. You also know that it took close to 6-months to rule on the merits of the case. As a contingency plan, I had been working with Gandy Corporation to locate suitable disposal sites near Lovington, NM in the event that their Albacore permit was rejected.

Now that they will NOT be able to dispose into the Wolfcamp zones (Abo only) we are beginning to discuss Gandy joining EverQuest Energy in the re-entry of the well subject to this SWD-1172 permit. There are many points that need to be mutually and separately considered in the process. We need enough time to work through the process. We believe that 12-months will allow us sufficient time to get this done.

Therefore, we respectfully ask that you consider the merits of our request and give us a favorable answer soon.
