Dear Mr. Porter:

I refer to your letter of October 14, 1957 by which you transmit Order No. DC-514 giving us administrative approval for subject dual completion in the Dakota and Mesa Verde gas horizons. In further connection with this matter, your Aztec office has informed us that we need approval for non-standard units as defined by GLO Plat of Township 31 North, Range 12 West, prepared by the United States Department of the Interior on November 18, 1953. The S $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 19 which would encompass the Mesa Verde unit amounts to 304.48 acres. The SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 19 representing the Dakota unit amounts to 151.30 acres.

We respectfully request your early action on this matter since buyer is awaiting C-110 approval before proceeding to hook up.


