Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application for administrative approval for exception to Rule 309 (a) in the Cone Pool of Eddy County, New Mexico.

It is understood that this exception to Rule 309 (a) is to be ascribed to your State "T-8" Lease known as State Lease No. E-7639 which is an 80-acre lease described as the N/2 NE/4 of Section 8; your State "P-5" Lease known as State Lease No. B-7596 which is an 80-acre lease described as the SW/4 SE/4 and NE/4 SE/4 of Section 5, and your State "U-5" and State "U-8" Leases known as State Lease No. E-4200 described as the NW/4 SE/4 and SE/4 NE/4 of Section 5 and the S/2 NE/4 of Section 8, all four leases being in Township 17 South, Range 29 East, NMPM, Cone Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.

By authority granted me under provisions of Rule 309, Section (4) and (5) of the New Mexico Statewide Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to operate a central tank battery on the above described acreage as an exception to Rule 309 (a).

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of the 10th day of August, 1934, in which you requested that the Commission advise you as to the status of the application for a license to operate a motor vehicle in the State of New Mexico.

The Commission has reviewed your application and finds that it is complete and that you are qualified to operate a motor vehicle in the State of New Mexico.

Accordingly, the Commission has issued to you a license to operate a motor vehicle in the State of New Mexico, which license is valid for a period of one year from the date of its issuance.

The license is subject to the provisions of the Motor Vehicle License Act, Chapter 100, Section 100-1, et seq., of the Statutes of the State of New Mexico, and to the rules and regulations of the Commission.

You are advised that the license is valid only for the operation of a motor vehicle in the State of New Mexico, and is not valid for the operation of a motor vehicle in any other State or Territory. You are also advised that the license is not valid for the operation of a motor vehicle in the State of New Mexico if you are under the influence of any intoxicating liquor or any narcotic drug at the time of operation.

The Commission has no objection to your operating a motor vehicle in the State of New Mexico, and you are advised that you may do so without further application to the Commission.
