Dear Mr. Porter:

I have two forty acre base state leases, but under different numbers. For instance B 8318 is known as Acrey Lease, and is located in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 36. Twp. 17-S.R. 27-E. I have three shallow wells on this particular forty. Being Nos. 1, 2, and 3 A. and producing from Seven Rivers formation at approximately 500' in depth. I have a 250 bbl. tank on this forty. Continental Pipe Line Tank No. 21947. I also have the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 36. Twp. 17-S. R. 27-E. N.M.P.M. on which I have 2 shallow wells, producing from the Seven Rivers formation at approximately 500' on lease No. E 1059. I am producing these two wells into a 250 bbl. tank. Continental Pipe Line Tank No. 21961.

The lease and over-riding interest are identically the same ^{to 1000'} on these 2 40 acre leases. I own $\frac{3}{16}$ working interest and Mrs. Vada Spurck is owner of $\frac{1}{16}$ over-riding interest on both 40's. Of course the State gets $\frac{1}{8}$ royalty from both 40's. What I would like to do, if permissible, is to comingle, or run the oil from E 1059 into the tank on B 8318, as I have a 250 bbl. tank on each lease and I wish to save one tank, as all of these wells only produce approximately 4 bbls. per day. I thought by writing you a full letter of explanation, and I will also draw a plat, sending it along, of these five wells and leases and maybe I can save a trip to Santa Fe for a hearing, etc.

I also have, or my associates and I, four producing wells on these two 40's, from approximately 1700 Ft in the Grayburg-Premier Sand, and I have 2-250 bbl. tanks on this 40 for this production. However, I have written the Phillips-Petroleum Co. regarding connection for the natural gas from these two wells, and they have just recently tested to see how much gas they were making and I told them at the time there were testing I would undertake to get these leases ^{combined} or to get the oil and gas transferred to Acrey Battery. Where a separator or whatever it would take to pick up my gas, and should they decide to give me a connection then I will also want to transfer my oil from E 1059 to Battery on B 8318, to comingle 1700' formation.

Will be glad to hear from you at your earliest convenience.
