CHAPTER I  
GENERAL STATEMENT

The Commission was organized by the State of New Mexico in 1937 to investigate the oil reservation at Santa Fe, New Mexico. The reservation was established in 1891 by the Santa Fe Oil and Gas Lease, which granted to the Santa Fe Oil and Gas Company the right to explore for and produce oil and gas on the reservation. The Commission's report is based on a study of the reservation and the surrounding area, and on a series of hearings held in Santa Fe, New Mexico, in 1937 and 1938.

CHAPTER II  
HISTORY OF THE RESERVATION

1. Discovery of Oil  
2. Lease to Santa Fe Oil and Gas Company

The first discovery of oil in the Santa Fe area was made in 1891 by the Santa Fe Oil and Gas Company. The company was organized by the Santa Fe Oil and Gas Company, which was a subsidiary of the Santa Fe Railway Company. The company was granted the right to explore for and produce oil and gas on the reservation. The first oil well was drilled in 1891, and the first oil was produced in 1892. The production of oil from the reservation has since that time been a major source of revenue for the State of New Mexico.

**Gentlemen:**

Reference is made to the application submitted by you for the Carthay Land Company dated April 21, 1961, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 309 (a) of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission to permit the commingling of the oil produced from the following described State of New Mexico oil and gas leases in the West Wilson Pool, to-wit:

State Lease No. B-7849 comprising the S/2 SW/4 and State Lease No. B-1830 comprising the N/2 SW/4, all in Section 16, Township 21 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 309 (b) of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, I hereby authorize you to commingle the production from the above-described leases from the West Wilson Pool in a common tank battery.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as authorizing the production of more than sixteen wells into a single tank battery.
