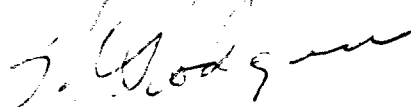

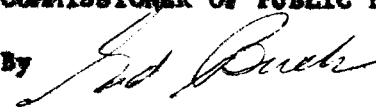

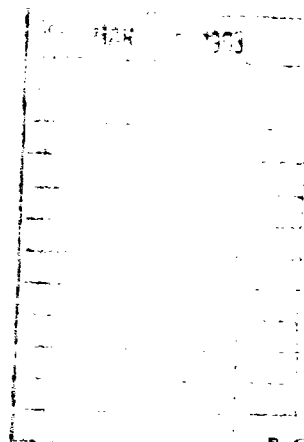

Diagram of Circulating Pump and Fuel System

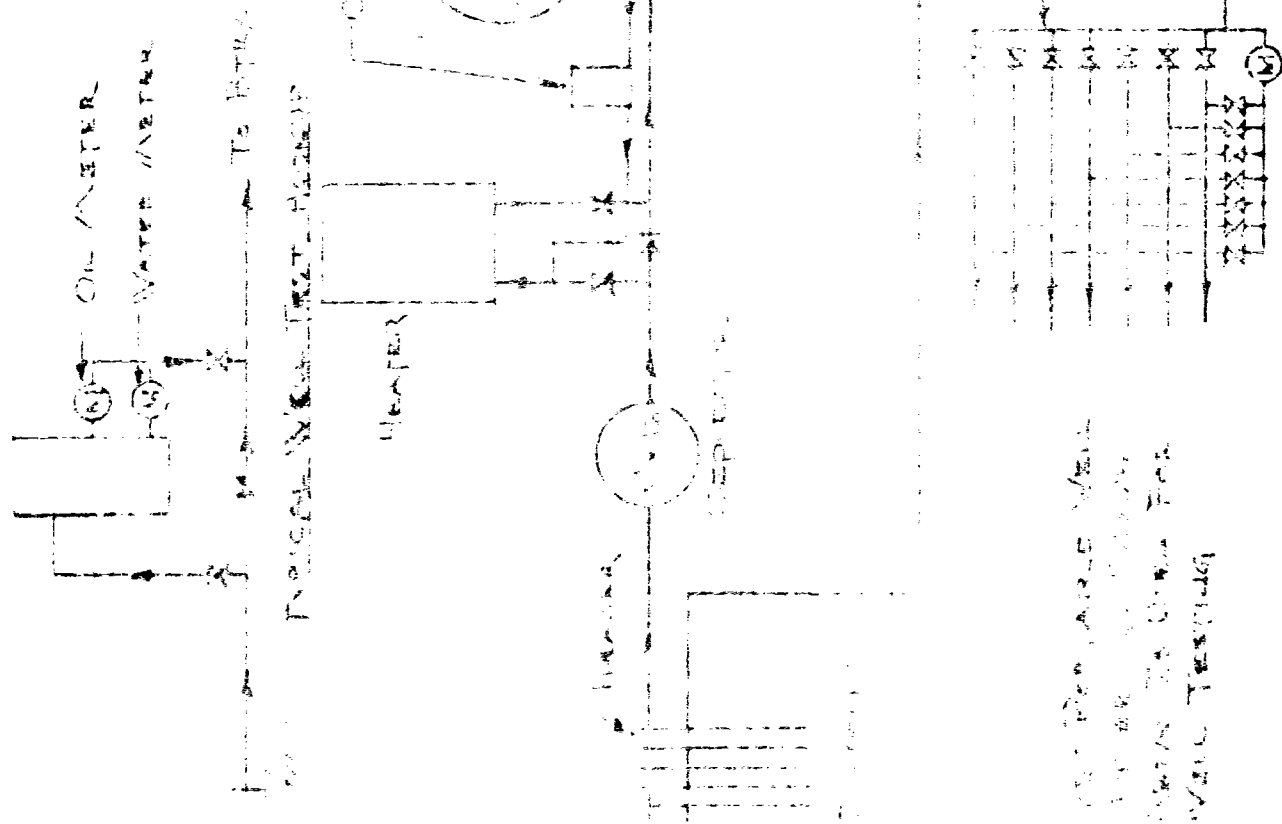
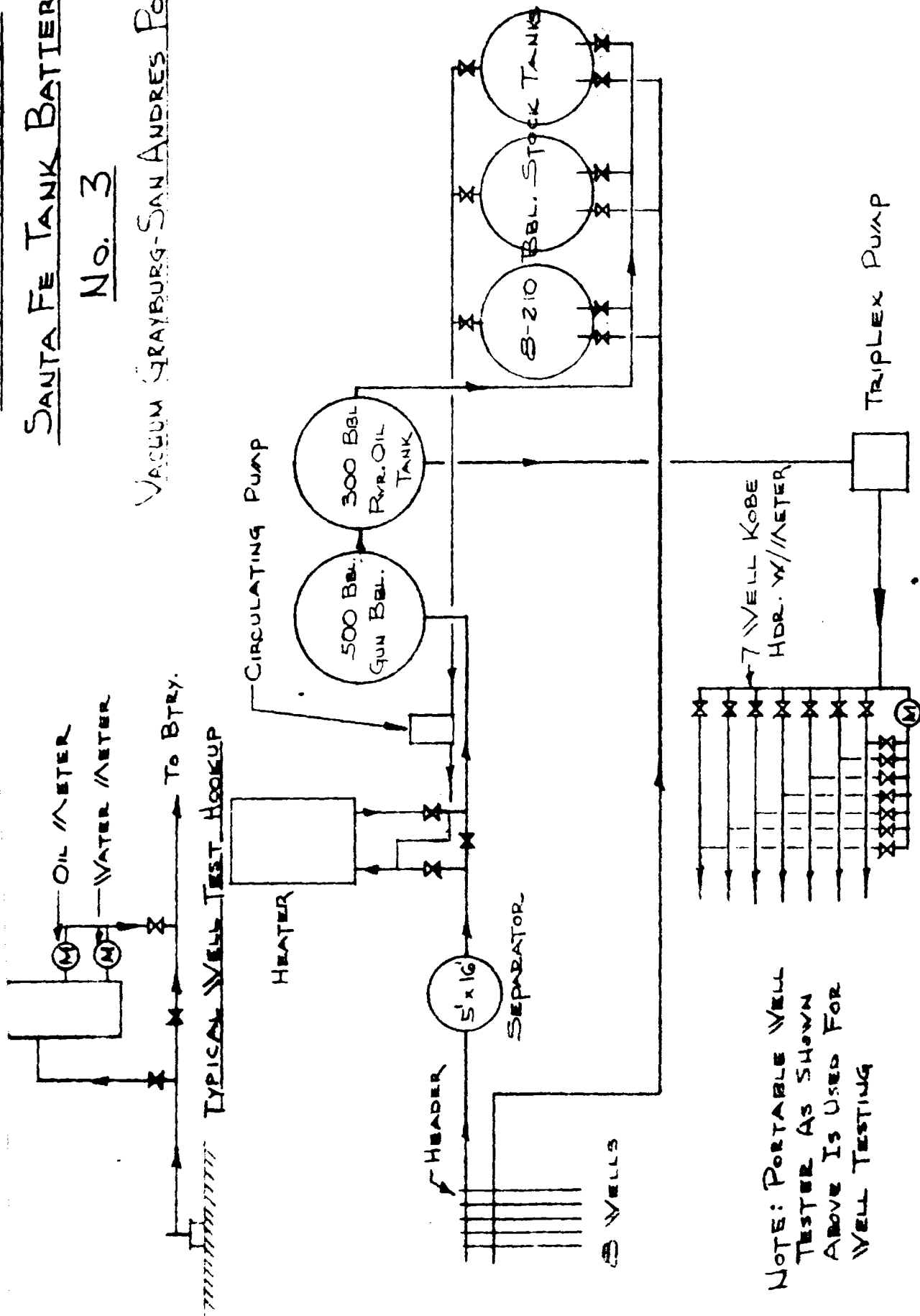


Diagram of Circulating Pump and Fuel System

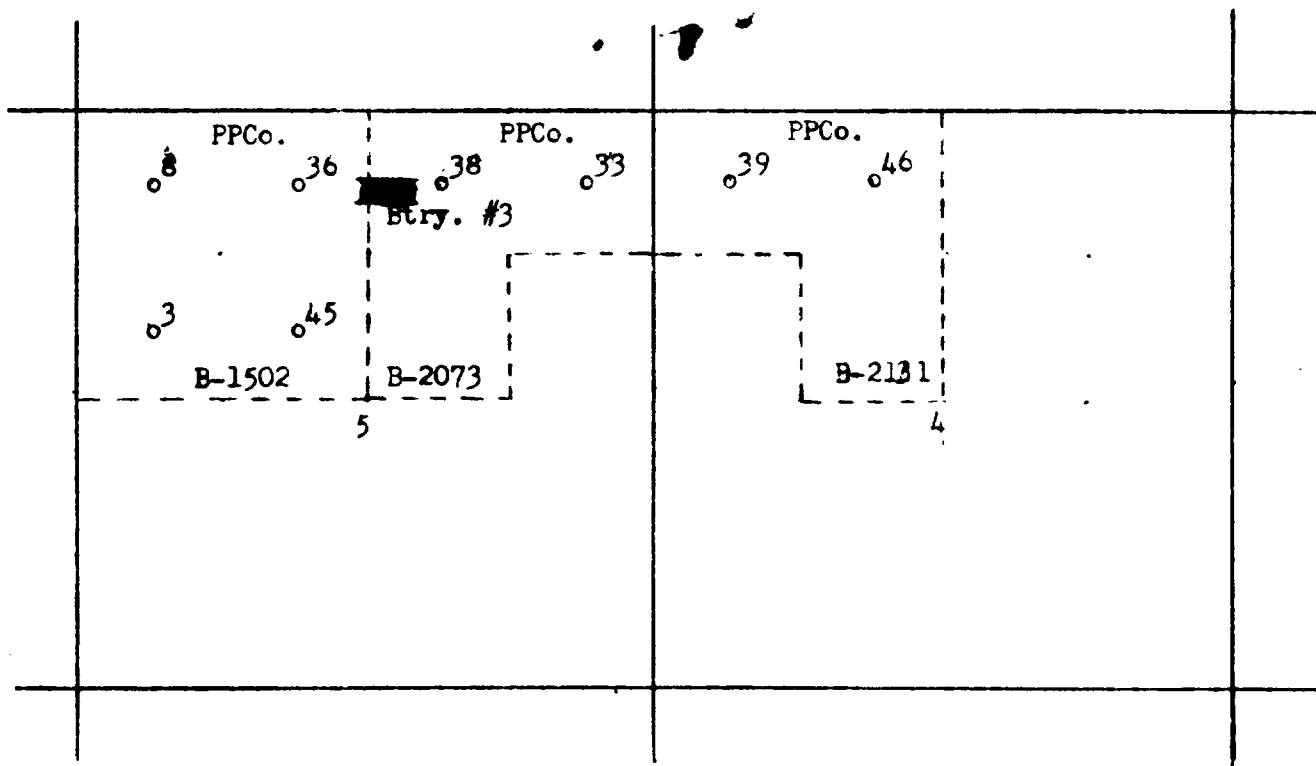
